## About the University

The Central University of Kerala (CUK) is one among the 16 Central Universities established under The Central Universities Act, 2009 (Parliament Act No. 25 of 2009) and came into existence on 2 March 2009. Under its first Vice Chancellor Prof. Jancy James, CUK started functioning from a transit campus at Vidyanagar in Kasaragod on 4th June 2009. It started four campuses across Kerala and laid the foundation for the present sprawling 310-acre campus at Tejaswini Hills, Periye. Its second Vice Chancellor, Prof. G Gopa Kumar moved all departments to the Periye campus, which houses 25 Departments offering PG and Ph.D. programmes. The CUK also has two off-campus centres – one at Pathanamthitta which houses one department offering PG and Ph.D. programmes and the other, Capital Centre at Thiruvananthapuram offering a UG programme.

Under its present Vice Chancellor, Prof. H. Venkateshwarlu, CUK focuses on bettering its academic, administrative, and infrastructural excellence and social commitment. ## FACILITIES

## Student Council

The Student Council of the University is constituted on the basis of direct election of two class representatives each from all teaching departments. They will form the electoral college from whom the officer bearers for each academic year are elected. The president and secretary of the Student's Council are members of the University Court. Two meritorious students (a boy and girl) are nominated by the Vice Chancellor to the Academic Council. The Student Council participates actively in the affairs of the University and organizes a cultural event known as CANKAMA every year.

## Library

The University Library, is a repository of learning resources on Arts, Humanities, Science and Social Sciences. The library supports research and educational endeavors of students, research scholars and the faculty members of the university by collecting, organizing, preserving and disseminating information. The library enables access to online information resources using modern Information & Communication Technologies. The library is automated with KOHA Open Source Integrated Library System. The library is using Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) system to organize the collection of information. University Library is fully automated and has OPAC & WebOPAC, Wi-Fi Network, Free Internet Access, Reprographics Facility, Inter Library Loan Facility, Article Alert and URKUND Plagiarism checking software. The library regularly conducts awareness programmes for its users.

## Aravalli Centre for Health and Medical Services

This centre started as medical clinic in Central University of Kerala on October 2016 with a vision to care for the comprehensive health status of students, staff of CUK and their dependents. Currently, it functions as a health facility, where all the basic health needs and medicines are provided free of cost, and is equal to a Sub Centre of health care system. ## Facility for Cultural Activities

The CUK has Cultural Committee which leads and motivates students to participate in a multitude of cultural activities. Together with a team of active students it coordinates and conducts several programs like Independence Day celebrations, University Foundation Day and "CANKAMA", the CUK Arts festival. The committee also motivates and extends necessary assistance for students to participate in various national level competitions and has been successful in winning accolades to CUK. #### Hostels

The University has six hostels named after the famous rivers of Kerala: Kabani, Nila, Pamba, Periyar and Neyyar with rooms having 2 to 4 beds. Each hostel building is designed to be an independent unit with its own kitchen, dining hall, reading room/library, television, water coolers, telephone facilities and and kit for indoor games. Wi-Fi or local area network (LAN) facilities are provided in every room and a seperate computer room is also provided in every hostel. Each hostel is managed by a faculty member as the warden. The hostel and mess committees are run by student inmates. A few more hostels are being constructed to increase the student intake over the years.

#### Facility for Grievances Redressal

The CUK's Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) addresses all complaints of sexual harassment at workplace as per the "Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013" or POSH Act (2013) and UGC Regulations, 2015 on Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions. #### **Facility for Sports Activities**

## **IPR Cell**

Patents: It shall be competent for the Executive Council to take out patents in respect of any discovery or invention made by the teachers or research students working in the University.

Right to be in joint name: The patent shall be taken in the joint names of the University and the person responsible for the discovery or invention.

Expenses of registration: The expenses in connection with the registration of patents shall be borne by the University.

Sharing of profits-Any profit accruing from the patent shall be shared equally between the University and the person responsible for the invention or discovery.

Exploitation of patents: The person responsible for the invention or discovery shall render free service to the University in connection with the exploitation of the patent. The terms on which patents may be offered for exploitation shall be determined solely by the Executive Council.

## SC/ST Special Cell

As per direction of Govt of India, the UGC at its 535 meeting held on 27th September, 2018 resolved to establish a SC/ST Cell in Central University of Kerala to comply the instructions of DoPT for setting up of Special Reservation Cell.

The main functions of the SC/ST Cell are:

To furnish the information on annual basis regarding course-wise admission to candidates belonging to the reserved categories in the Universities for different course, in forms prescribed, by a stipulated date, and to take follow up action, where required.

To furnish information in respect of appointment, training of these communities in teaching and nonteaching posts in the University and take follow up action where required.

To furnish various information on the various aspects of education, training and employment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates, for evolving new policies or modifying existing policy by the Commission.

To prepare reports and digests for onward transmission to the Ministry of Human Resource Development/University Grants Commission and such other authorities as may be required.

To deal with representations received from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates regarding their admission, recruitment, promotion and other similar matters in Universities/Colleges.

To monitor the working of the remedial coaching scheme, if approved in the University. To function as Grievances Redressal Cell for the Grievances of SC/ST students and employees of the University and render them necessary help in solving their academic as well as administrative problems.
