## **Valedictory Session**

The workshop was inaugurated by the Hon'ble. Vice Chancellor of the Central University of Kerala, Prof. (Dr.) G. Gopakumar. The first technical session by Prof. M. S. John stressed upon the need for social science researchers to be public intellectuals, acting as watchdogs of the society's progress by carrying out useful and methodologically sound research. There was also a discussion on how social science research in India has been lagging behind the rest of the world qualitatively, despite the enormity in terms of publications.

Prof. M. Somasekharan Pillai detailed the technical nuances of social science research like research procedure and the various tools employed in primary research like sampling and statistical analysis.

Dr. Efthikar Ahamed B. outlined the importance of literature review in research and explained the dos and don'ts therein.

The fifth technical session by Dr. Mohan A. K. dealt with field work in social science research. His session included a discussion on the objectives and importance of field work and the skills required.

Dr. V. P. Jyoshith enlightened the students on the ethical and moral questions faced by researchers and how to reach a middle ground between establishing the facts as they are, while addressing the underlying ethical questions.

The seventh technical session by Dr. Amruth G. Kumar introduced the students to phenomenological research. This session was very interactive and helped students gain a firsthand experience in phenomenology via discussions and a mock questionnaire.

Dr. Channa Basavaiah, an expert in research methodology and his session on plagiarism gave the students a peek into the various forms of plagiarism including its latest variants. He laid down a simple procedure for the students to adopt while carrying out research so that they steer clear off any malpractices, including plagiarism.

The ninth technical session by Dr. Ravishankar S. Nair elaborated upon the philosophy of social science research. He stressed on the importance of carrying this intellectual exercise forward in the spirit of community so that the knowledge generated from research serves the larger public.

Dr, P. Senthilkumaran introduced the students to the latest technological advancements that can aid and simplify research like various applications, programs and software associated with compiling research.

The valedictory session was held after the tenth technical session. It featured a qualitative assessment of the three day workshop, with the participants freely voicing their feedbacks and ideas for improvement.

The three-day national level workshop on Research Methodology was definitely a step in the right direction as evidenced by the feedback received from the students, especially the Ph.D scholars. The technical sessions were marked by active participation from the students which made them highly effective. The workshop clearly helped identify the lull in terms of methodologically sound research originating from India. This can be attributed to several factors like, a lack of commitment towards making any relevant social change, resorting to

indiscriminate plagiarism and intellectual thievery, a lack of proper academic structures to carry out peer reviews and rate scholarly works etc. There needs to be a staunch focus on the quality of research work in India as we are moving towards an age wherein patented and copyrighted knowledge would be seen as a crucial element of national power. This workshop was successful in laying down the facts as they are and in encouraging the students to take proactive action to be good researchers in the future.
