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Sampathkumar [F. Harary, $Graph\ Theory\ (Addison-Wesley,\ Reading,\ MA,\ 1969)]$ defined the coloring of a digraph D=(V,A) as a coloring of its vertices by the following rule: Let uv be an arc in D. If the tail u is colored first, then the head v should receive a color different from that of u. But, if v is colored first, then u may or may not receive the color of v. The $dichromatic\ number$ $\chi_d(D)$ of a digraph D is the minimum number of colors needed for coloring of a digraph D. In this paper, we obtain some results on uniquely colorable digraphs and Nordhaus-Gaddum type results for digraphs.
