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Whereas, the parties hitherto have satisfied the urgent need for setting up a new laboratory equipped with modern sophisticated equipment and highly qualified scientists to combat the alarming spread of Covid-19 pandemic,

Whereas, it is mutually consented by the parties hitherto that a new COVID-19 testing laboratory for facilitating RT-PCR or Advanced tests of similar nature to combat the spread of Covid-19 virus has to be installed on a war footing basis in the district and have identified the Building available with the second party as suitable for the purpose,

Whereas, the second party herein shall provide personnel with advanced scientific qualifications and skills to train and guide officials for the conduct of Covid-19 RT- PCR Test or any other tests similar in nature as required by the third party.

Whereas, the third party shall provide all necessary equipments and kits required for the establishment of the laboratory and the machinery shall become part of the laboratory maintained by the second party,

Whereas, all the transfer of the equipment by the third party to the second party shall be made under the proper acknowledgment by the officers concerned under the second party.

Whereas, it is mutually agreed between the parties that, as and when the third party sends specimen collected from patients admitted in any hospital under the third party or any hospital declared as Covid-19 hospital by the State Government or the first party as the case may be, shall be received by the laboratory so established and the required test shall be conducted on a war footing basis to get accurate reading and shall be returned to the third party within such time as may be agreed between them on a case to case basis,

Whereas, the first party has agreed to arrange to get any orders from the Government and necessary fund at the disposal of the second or third party as the case may be, for making any development of the laboratory or for making any additional facility for meeting future orgent requirements.

Whereas, the first party and third party have agreed to permit utilization of the above facility for academic research and programs specific to the viral diseases and molecular pathogenesis by the second party without affecting the aforementioned diagnostic functions of the laboratory,

Whereas, the third party, with the concurrence of the first party, shall provide necessary supporting staff like Lab Technician and other paramedical staff on daily wage basis, in addition to the scientific experts under the second party, if found necessary for the smooth functioning of the lab,

And whereas, it is mutually agreed between the parties that necessary PPE kns and other protective equipments required for the scientists and other staff working in the lab shall be provided by the third party as and when required.

This MOU is initially for a period of two years and may be renewed by mutual consent on same or revised terms as may be settled between the parties to this MOU.

Both institutions agree to cooperate in the following potential programs:

Implementation of the exchange programs

- 1. The programs listed above are to be carried out after mutual consultation
- 2. The parties may enter into specific additional written MoU here under to clarify and define the nature, extent and terms of operation for the proposed collaborations, including intellectual property ownership and funding issues.
- 3. Prior to entering into any such MoUs, these MoUs will require the approval of appropriate officers from each institution.
- 4. For agreed upon activities, both institutions will make available their facilities and staffs as further defined in such MoUs.

Terms of the MoU

This MoU shall become effective when the representative of both institutions put their signatures below and shall remain effective for five (5) years. The MoU shall be automatically renewed at the end of the five-year term unless one or both of the institutions propose otherwise.

Revision and termination of the MoU

Both parties must send written notice and consult with each other at least 60 days before revision or termination of the MoU.

Questions and Problems with respect to the MoU

Should any problems or questions on any part of this MoU arise, both universities must consult with one another to find a solution.

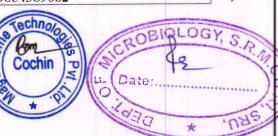

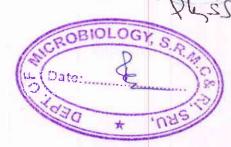

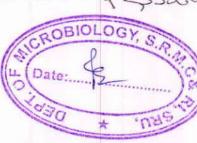

1. FUND DISBURSEMENT

i. First installment of the Grant-in-aid will be released after issue of the GLA subject to fulfillment of the terms and conditions for such release (and after execution of Royalty Agreement) by the relevant Parties. Further release of funds shall be subject to satisfactory progress against the objectives, outputs, milestones and targets specified in the Project which progress shall be determined by BIRAC and on submission of audited/certified statements of accounts and utilization certificates as provided for in Point 2 (a).

FUND UTILISATION AND ACCOUNTING

Institutes collaborator shall keep the Grant-in-aid assistance in an interest bearing account with a Scheduled Bank (as defined under the RBI Act, 1934), the withdrawals and payments from which account shall be subject to verification by BIRAC. The interest earned on the Grant-in-aid should be reported to BIRAC. The interest thus earned on the grant in aid will

be adjusted towards further installment of the fund.

The Fund Recipient shall ensure that the funds released for the Project are actually utilized only for the purposes of the Project and as expressly provided for in this GLA. Re-

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appropriation of BIRAC funds from one budget head to another shall not be effected without the specific written approval of BIRAC;

- h. The Fund Recipient shall refund such part of Grant-in-aid funds disbursed to it that remains unutilized with it upon completion of all the responsibilities, duties and functions specified in connection with the Project, within one month of such completion, to BIRAC along with consolidated accounts of the funds received and utilized and of the unutilized balance returned (UC &SOE);
- i. The Fund Recipient at their own cost shall take adequate care to maintain the capital assets acquired for the Project through BIRAC's Grant-in-aid. The capital assets acquired through BIRAC's Grant-in-aid shall not be disposed of or hypothecated without the specific approval of BIRAC till full and final settlement of all dues to the satisfaction of BIRAC.
- j. The Procurements for the Project shall be in accordance with the best commercial practices if the fund recipient is a Company/LLP and shall be in accordance with the procurement framework prescribed by BIRAC if the fund recipient is a Government/public Institution.
- k. The Fund Recipient shall give prior information to BIRAC about additional funding from any other government/ private source (National/ International) for the same project objectives availed at any time before the project completion.

3. NATIONALLY IMPORTANT PROJECTS:

If certain projects are determined as Nationally important Projects, then BIRAC will issue a specific "Order" to make the following provisions applicable;

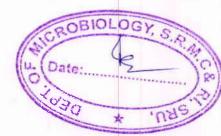
- A. In such cases of national importance BIRAC shall retain a royalty-free, non-exclusive, irrevocable license to the Product developed with the funding support of BIRAC with right to sub-license for the purposes of public interest/Government of India and/or as decided by the committee. The licensor of such Product will ensure that where the Product has been produced in collaboration with entities not in receipt of BIRAC's Grant-in-aid, such collaborators will also grant license to BIRAC in the same way.
- B. Nationally Important Projects shall mean such Projects that will serve specific purposes notified by Government of India in public interest.
- C. In cases of national importance, if BIRAC determines that such
 - a) Action is necessary because the Fund Recipient or licensee/s has not taken, within the period of four (4) years from the date of completion of the Project, effective steps to commercialize the Product in such field of use;
 - b) Action is necessary to meet requirements for public use or national interest and such requirements are not reasonably satisfied by the Fund Recipient or licensee/s;

Then, March-in-rights are applicable whereby;

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- i. BIRAC along with retainment of royalty-free, non-exclusive, irrevocable license to the Product, after taking into consideration the fund recipient's requirement for reasonable expansion and the demand supply gap at the appropriate time, shall have the right to require the Fund Recipient to transfer the technical know-how of the Product developed under the Project to other entrepreneur(s) and train them, on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed among BIRAC, the fund recipient and such other entrepreneur(s). Provided, BIRAC shall reserve its right to require that the Product must be manufactured and sold in India.
- ii. If the fund recipient (s) does not agree with the terms of above sub section (i), then BIRAC shall require that all rights and interests associated with the Product including Intellectual Property (IP) Rights to be assigned to BIRAC. The Fund Recipient(s) and co-owners of the IP shall undertake all necessary actions to affect the assignment.

**SCLOSURE OBLIGATIONS FOR INSTITUTES AND NOT FOR PROFIT ENTITIES:

- a. The institute shall promptly disclose the commencement of commercialization of products through spinoffs, licensec, sub-licensee, assignee or other third parties.
- b. The institute shall submit the true copy of the contractual arrangement related to any interests of the Product including licensing agreement, technology transfer agreement, assignment deed etc.
- c. The Institute shall intimate the receipt of technology transfer fee, licensing fee, royalty, or revenue in any form resulting due to product commercialization, within sixty days from the closure of the corresponding half yearly accounts.

5. PROJECT MONITORING

A Project Monitoring Committee (PMC) comprising of eminent experts from the respective field(s)/Internal BIRAC and NBM members will be constituted to monitor the progress of the objective(s) of the Project. The functions of the PMC shall be as follows:

- a. To monitor the progress of the Project in conformity with the outputs, milestones, targets objectives and other terms and conditions as contained in the GLA
- b. To keep track of funding from any other source for the Project.
- c. To assess the global developments impacting the domain of the Project.
- d. Based on the foregoing, to assess and recommend:
 - i. the release of next installment or part release thereof by the BIRAC.
 - ii. revision of Project Duration
 - iii. closing, dropping or modifying any of the components of the Project, within the overall approved objectives, budget and time-frame,
 - iv. inclusion of additional industrial/institutional partner(s), if the Fund Recipient and the Institutes requests involvement of such partner(s), in the overall interest of the Project;
 and
 - v. revision of the financial assistance.
- e. To advise on issues related to securing of IPR and mentor to overcome any technological problem faced in the Project implementation; and

To advise on any other matter as referred to it by BIRAC and/or otherwise reasonably necessary for effective discharge of its duties and/or achievement of aims and objectives of

necessary for effective of the Schemes.

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6. INDEMNIFICATION

- a. The Fund Recipient shall, at all times, indemnify and keep indemnified BIRAC against any claims or suits in respect of any losses, damages or compensation payable in consequences of any accident, death or injury sustained by their employees or by any other third party resulting from or by any act, omission or operation conducted by or on their behalf;
- b. The Fund Recipient shall, at all times, indemnify and keep indemnified BIRAC against all claims/damages etc. by any infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) while carrying out their responsibilities/work under the Project and this GLA.
- c. The provision of Grant-in-aid funds by BIRAC does not create any liability, explicit or implicit, on BIRAC in respect of the manpower engaged in the Project.
- d. The Parties shall not be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations in successful completion of the Project under this GLA due to the exigency of one or more force majeure events such as but not limited to acts of God, war, flood, carthquakes etc.
 - e. BIRAC through the Project funding shall not be held as a "Sponsor" in terms of the Clinical Trial statutes and the Fund Recipient are entirely responsible for abiding by the relevant laws, Rules and Regulations of the land if any Phase of the Clinical Trial is a Project Component.

7. CHANGE OF CONTROL:

BIRAC shall reserve the right to reconsider further funding assistance, governance of the New Intellectual Property and consider refund of the amount of Grant-in-aid in such circumstances of change of control as mentioned the following paragraphs;

- a. The Fund Recipient shall inform BIRAC if it proposes to undertake or permit any merger, consolidation, reorganization scheme of arrangement or compromise with its creditors or shareholders or effect any scheme of amalgamation or reconstitution or substantial expansion. The word 'substantial expansion' shall have the same meaning as under the Industries (development and Regulation) Act, 1951.
- b. The Fund Recipient shall inform BIRAC within 30 (thirty) days, if it has notice of any application for winding up having been made or any statutory notice of winding up under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, or any other notice under any other Act or otherwise of any suit or other legal process intended to be filed or initiated against the Fund Recipient and affecting the title to the properties of the Fund Recipient or if a receiver is appointed of any of its properties or business or undertaking.
- c. The Fund Recipient shall notify BIRAC of any material change in its shareholding pattern, entity status, entity name, Project Coordinator, implementation site, registered office or any such change that would impact on performance of its obligations under the Project and this GLA.

8. FORECLOSURE AND TERMINATION

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a. In case, during the Project Duration, it is found that the Project or any Project component is not likely to lead to successful completion, BIRAC may decide to foreclose the Project or the Project component as warranted. The decision of the BIRAC shall be final in all respects. The Fund Recipient shall immediately refund any Grant-in-aid unutilized out of BIRAC s disbursements to BIRAC. BIRAC, at its discretion can allow deduction of the future committed expenses to third party vendors on pro-rate basis according to the

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quantum of BIRAC's funding. The Fund Recipient shall submit consolidated accounts of funds received, utilized and unutilized (UC&SOE). If the Fund Recipient likes to continue the Project at its own cost, it would be able to do so without restrictions from BIRAC after complying with these provisions.

b. The Fund Recipient may, before the completion of the Project, terminate this GLA by giving three months' notice in writing to BIRAC. BIRAC may also terminate this GLA by written notice in the event of committing breach of any term of this GLA and either not rectifying it to the satisfaction of BIRAC or not satisfying BIRAC about its inevitability within a specified period. In the event of termination of the GLA, no further disbursement shall be made by BIRAC. The Company shall be liable to return immediately the amount of Grant-in-aid already availed of from BIRAC with additional simple interest at the rate of 12 (twelve) per cent per annum within 30 (thirty) days of termination of the GLA. Interest on the quantum of funding assistance shall accrue from the date of release of the grant in aid assistance. The Collaborators Institutes shall immediately refund any funds unutilized out of BIRAC's disbursements, to BIRAC, along with consolidated accounts of funds received, utilized and unutilized (UC&SOE). In case of failure to repay, without prejudice to any other rights under this GLA, the amount can be recovered by initiating any procedure available in Law.

9. DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND ARBITRATION

In the event of any dispute or difference between the Parties hereto upon or in relation to or in connection with this GLA, such dispute or difference, shall be resolved amicably and in good faith by mutual consultation.

If such resolution is not possible, then the unresolved dispute or difference whatsoever arising between the Parties out of or relation to the construction, meaning, scope, operation or effect of this GLA or the validity the breach thereof or in respect of any defined legal relationship associated therewith or derived there from dispute shall be submitted for arbitration to International Center for Alternate Dispute Resolution (ICADR), an autonomous organization working under the aegis of the Ministry of Law & Justice, Department of Legal Affairs, Government of India. The Authority to appoint the arbitrator(s) shall be the ICADR. The Arbitration under this Clause and provision of administrative services by ICADR shall be in accordance with the ICADR Arbitration Rules, 1996 read with The New Delhi International Arbitration Centre Act 2019. The award made in pursuance thereof shall be binding on the Parties. The venue of arbitration shall be New Delhi and the arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in English Language. The provision of this Clause shall not become inoperative notwithstanding the GLA expiring or ceasing to exist or being terminated or foreclosed.

10. EFFECT AND AMENDMENTS TO THE GLA

b.

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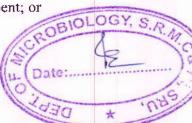
a. GLA shall remain in force for whichever of these is the longest time unless suspended sooner:

a. For <u>08 Months</u> (Project duration) months from the above Effective Date subject to the **P** Change Order(s) issued by the BIRAC from time to time

As long as any part of the amount disbursed for the Project remains unspent; or

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- For as long as any monitoring or recording or IP governance is required under any relevant laws and regulations.
- b. No amendment or modification of this GLA shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by the Parties or their authorized representatives specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this GLA. The modifications / changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made / executed unless otherwise agreed to.

11. SEVERABILITY

In case any one or more of the provisions or parts of a provision contained in this GLA shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision or part of a provision of this GLA; and this GLA shall, to the fullest extent lawful, be construed as if such invalid or illegal or unenforceable provision, or part of a provision, had never been contained herein.

12. GOVERNING LAW

This GLA and the associated undertaking shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of India subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts at New Delhi.

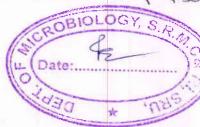

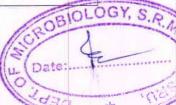

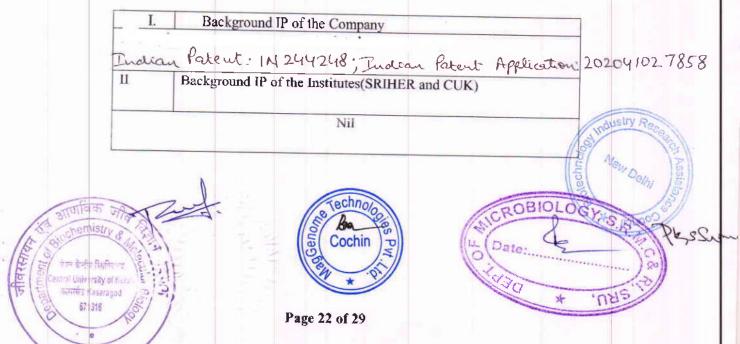

This Memorandum of Understanding (herein after referred to as MoU) is made on the 10th September, 2021, between The Central University of Kerala (CUK), (hereinafter referred to as CUK), a Central Government Institution of Higher education established by The Central Universities Act, 2009, under the ordinance Section 6 (1) and Section 28 (1) (k) of the Act), having its headquarters at Tejaswini Hills, Periya PO, Kasaragod, Kerala - 671320 on one part

AND

The North Malabar Chamber of Commerce which is an association incorporated in 1952, registered at Registrar of Companies, Kannur, Kerala, India, with Identification Number as IN NO:U91110KL1952NPL001580, and registered address as No.MT81, Thayatheru- Kannur, Tellicherry Road, Kannur, Kerala (NMCC), (mentioned hereafter as "NMCC"), on the other part as partners for promoting research and application of the technological output, visits of members of both the CUK and NMCC, joint hosting of events of mutual interest and carry on the objectives of the MOU.

1. PARTNER BACKGROUND

Central University of Kerala: CUK a Central Government Institution of Higher education established by The Central Universities Act, 2009, under the ordinance Section 6 (1) and Section 28 (1) (k) of the act), having its headquarters at Tejaswini Hills, Periya PO, Kasaragod, Kerala, 671320.

CUK is founded on the noble vision of a 'caring wisdom' and is guided by the lofty ideals of academic and social commitment, moral steadfastness and intellectual and spiritual enlightenment, as reflected in its vision statement. Located in a region characterized by linguistic and ethnic diversity and cultural richness, the University seeks to harness the local resources – human, intellectual, social, artistic and cultural – while bringing in the best that is globally available, thus maintaining a fruitful, symbiotic relationship with a region that badly needs an educational uplift.

NMCC: In 1952 a group of nine prominent Traders and Industrialists of Kannur formed an Association for protecting and promoting the interests of the business community and registered it under the Indian Companies Act in the name and style of The North Malabar Chamber of Commerce. Over the years, the Chamber has evolved and redefined its role from

espousing the causes of traders and industrialists to becoming a prime mover for transforming the North Malabar region through developmental initiatives.

The Chamber's relentless focus on removing the backwardness of this region has culminated in many projects which have either been commissioned or are in different stages of completion. The Kannur International Airport, Azhikkal Port, Textile Centre at Nadukani, Inland Container Depot, NIFT Centre, GI Registration for Cannanore Home Furnishing Products are some of these. In addition, NMCC is actively following up the Kannur Power Project, Thalassery-Mysore Railway Link, National Highway Development, Bye-pass Roads, Express Highway, Agri Food Park, Tourism Development, Permanent Exhibition Centre for Handloom Products, Central University in Kasargod District etc. NMCC has played a key role in getting Kannur recognised as a "Town of Export Excellence" by the Union Ministry of Commerce.

2. COMMON OBJECTIVES

CUK and NMCC want to work jointly to facilitate industry, academia and research collaboration in the areas of mutual interest. Moreover, to increase the relevance of industry exposure to the students, researchers and faculty members of the CUK and to have continuous interaction by the members of NMCC with the CUK in areas of mutual interest, this MoU will be a facilitating mechanism. To collaborate, to share and exchange information between both parties for mutual benefit, knowledge enhancement and to facilitate visits from CUK to NMCC and NMCC to CUK. The aim of this MoU is also to enhance participation in and co-hosting of lectures, meetings, seminars, symposia and conferences, develop indigenous technologies, conduct trade fairs, exhibitions, industry products and services campaigns, exposure to start ups and new product developments and promotion.

3. SCOPE OF MOU

Within the scope of this MoU, CUK and NMCC agree to conduct the following activities. However, the terms and conditions for conducting these activities mentioned below will be agreed upon through separate and specific agreements.

- 3.1. Conducting career guidance seminars inviting prominent members from the industry.
- 3.2. Interactive sessions between Members of NMCC and various Departments of CUK for training and development of students.
- 3.3. Creating collaborative platforms for conducting Job fairs and Placement drives.
- 3.4. Creating intellectual properties which can be useful for the University departments as well as the Industry.

- 3.5. Collaborating in the areas of carrying out market research and brand promotion for NMCC members with the help of various departments of the CUK.
- 3.6. Conduct Management Development program for the members of NMCC.
- 3.7. Collaborating in conducting trade fairs, business meets and other related activities.
- 3.8. Create collaborative platform for Student start ups, its incubation and funding.
- 3.9. Any other areas of collaboration mutually agreed between CUK and NMCC.

4. FINANCE

Regarding the financial arrangements during the Project implementation, CUK and NMCC further agree to:

- 4.1 Both the institutions will engage services of the existing employees for the Programme.
- 4.2 Financial arrangements for implementation of the MoU will be subject to mutually agreed terms to be specified in a separate terms of co-operation (ToC).

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Any material developed through activities pursuant to this MoU will be the joint property of both CUK and NMCC. Any such material may be disseminated by a party only after obtaining prior written consent of the other party.

6. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING

For implementing and monitoring of the programme, CUK and NMCC also agree that:

- 6.1 The interaction between **CUK and NMCC** will be implemented by creating a Coordination Committee with nominated Officials as its members from both **CUK and NMCC**
- 6.2 If the activities could result in the form of publication/patent then the Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) will be with both the institutes with due percentage share mutually agreed upon.

Notwithstanding this MoU, CUK and NMCC will sign separate agreement for specific projects.

7. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 7.1 Each party shall undertake to maintain the confidentiality of the documents, information and other data received from the other party during the period of implementation of this MoU or any other agreement made pursuant to this MoU.
- 7.2. Both parties agree that the confidentiality clause shall continue to be binding between the parties notwithstanding the termination of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 7.3. This is exclusive of those cases in which disclosure of such confidential documents or information is mandatory under prevailing laws.

8. FORCE MAJEURE

In the event of either Party not being able, by reason of force majeure, to meet any of its obligations under this MoU, such obligation shall be suspended for as long as the inability

continues or any date mutually agreed between the Parties, provided that Party gives to the other Party written notice within fourteen (14) days after the occurrence of any such event.

- 8.1 Neither Party shall be liable to the other Party for any loss or damage sustained by the other Party arising from the occurrence of any such event.
- 8.2 The term 'force majeure' as employed herein shall mean an event not within the control of either Party which, by the exercise of due diligence, neither Party is able to overcome and this, includes any act of God, strike, lockout or other industrial disturbance, wars, insurrections or riots, civil disturbances as well as explosions.

9. LIABILITY

- 9.1. Both CUK and NMCC shall be solely responsible for any and all claims and/or damages in connection with the exercise of its objectives hereunder.
- 9.2. Both parties further agree that no employment relationship or partnership, express or implied, is created between them.

10. INDEMNITY

Both parties hereby indemnify and shall keep indemnified and protected the other party and their respective officers and employees from and against any claims or actions arising out of or in any way relating to the provision and implementation of the Programme as per this MoU.

11. DURATION OF MoU

The MOU would be effective for a period of 5 years from the date of signing it. It may be extended after expiry of such period and on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

12. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Both Parties warrant that this MoU is not likely to have any conflict of interest with any of their organizational, financial, contractual or other interests relating to the activities under this MoU.

13. AMENDMENTS

- 13.1 Either Party may request in writing for a revision, amendment or modification of all or any part of this MoU.
- 13.2 Any revision, amendment or modification agreed to between the Parties shall be in writing and shall come into force on such date as determined by the Parties and shall form part of this MoU.

14. TERMINATION

14.1. Either Party may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding at any time by means of at least 90 calendar days written notice to the other Party.

14.2. The early termination of this Memorandum of Understanding will not affect the completion of any co-operation measures that were agreed under the annual work programmes whilst it was in force.

15. JURISDICTION

Signatures and seals of the Parties:

In the event of any dispute arising out of this MoU, the parties agree that the High court of Kerala alone will have the jurisdiction.

The two parties of this MoU agree to act in good faith and in a spirit of mutual understanding and accommodation to facilitate the achievement of goals set under the Programme.

The Gethe-Zentrum is an autonomous body set-up by the world-wide organization named Goethe-Institut, under the auspices of the German Foreign Office to promote German language and intercultural and academic/scientific cooperation with Germany. The Goethe Zentrum in Trivandrum is managed by the Indo-German Language and Cultural Society registered under the Trancancore-Cochin Literary, Scientific and Charitable Societies Registration Act 1955.

The aforesaid institutions are hereinafter referred to individually as *University* and *Institute*.

Whereas the Institute has the competence to offer expertise and training in matters related to German Language, which could be made use of by the University through academic collaboration with Department of International Relations of the Central University of Kerala, at its Capital Centre, to facilitate academic linkage and interaction.

Memorandum of Understanding between Central University of Kerala and

Petrozavodsk State University

This Memorandum of Understanding (herein after referred to as MoU) is made on the 10 June, 2021, between The Central University of Kerala, (hereinafter referred to as FIRST PARTY) a Central Government Institution of Higher education established by The Central Universities Act, 2009, under the ordinance Section 6 (1) and Section 28 (1) (k) of the act, having its headquarters at Tejaswini Hills, Periya PO, Kasaragod, Kerala, 671320 on one part and The Petrozavodsk State University, (mentioned hereafter as SECOND PARTY), on the other part as partners for promoting, research and application of the technological output.

WHEREAS both FIRST PARTY and SECOND PARTY desire to engage in activities for promoting research, academic collaboration and exchange, herein referred to as "Programme", jointly with the diligence and efficiency as desired within this MoU in conformity with appropriate administrative, financial and educational practices of the parties and shall invoke such plans and activities and reforms as required for the Programme.

WHEREAS the FIRST PARTY and SECOND PARTY agree to enter into 'R&D Interactive programs' and both the parties agree to enter into an MoU with the terms as follows.

1. OBJECTIVES

Both parties hereby agree to associate with each other with the following major objectives:

- 1.1. To facilitate academic and research collaboration in the areas of mutual interest.
- 1.2. To increase the relevance of the academic research and consultancy in the research and product development initiatives.
- 1.3. Collaborate to share and exchange information between both parties for mutual benefit and knowledge enhancement.
- 1.4. Exchange of students and faculties.
- 1.5. To allow the use of research facilities including laboratories, library, CLIF/CIF, animal house and hostel/guest house facilities for the visiting students and faculties at the rate similar to that is available to the students and faculties of the respective host institutions.
- 1.6. To conduct joint/collaborative research and consultancy programs to develop indigenous technologies.
- 1.7. Participation in and co-hosting of lectures, meetings, seminars, symposia and conferences.

2. IMPLEMENTATION

- 2.1. The programs listed above are to be carried out after mutual consultation.
- 2.2. The parties may enter into specific additional written MoU hereunder to clarify and define the nature, extent and terms of operation for the proposed collaborations, including intellectual property ownership and funding issues.
- 2.3. Prior to entering into any such MoUs, these MoUs will require the approval from the authorities concerned of respective institutions.
- 2.4. For agreed-upon activities, both institutions will make available their facilities and staff as further defined in such MoUs.

3. TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- 3.1. Student Exchange: Pursuant to the agreement for academic exchange, FIRST PARTY and SECOND PARTY will exchange students according to the terms mentioned in Annexure-I. It is desired by both parties that there will be a significant flow of students in both directions.
- 3.2. Research Collaboration: Faculty from both institutions will collaborate in the supervision of exchange students and in joint research disciplines of mutual interest. All such joint research activities will be governed by the terms mentioned in Annexure-II

4. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING

For implementing and monitoring of the Programme, FIRST PARTY and SECOND PARTY also agree that:
