Central University of Kerala (CUK) Campus Traffic and Parking Regulations

- The Registrar of the CUK shall designate the driveways on the campus open to traffic and place appropriate signs indicating the time and conditions under which driveways may be used.
- 2. The Registrar shall designate spaces on the campus and parking facility to park the vehicles of faculty, staff, students, and visitors.
- All personnel on campus, including officials, faculty, staff, students, and visitors, will comply with CUK campus traffic and parking regulations.
- 4. No person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicles on any campus driveways except for personnel involved in emergency services like security, police, ambulance, or persons involved in loading and unloading merchandise.
- 5. All vehicles cars and motorbikes of faculty, staff, and students shall be registered by filling out a vehicle registration form available with the security post at the front gate and the CUK website. Only registered vehicles will be allowed entry on campus. All other vehicles will have to take a visitor's pass valid only for 4 hours except in cases given special allowance like vehicles of construction workers, contractors, delivery drivers, etc. The regulation does not apply to vehicles owned by CUK or vehicles hired to bring in guests of the University.
- 6. Parking of Vehicles on campus will be based on permits issued by the Estate Section of the University. These parking permits should be displayed on the vehicle at all times when parking the vehicle on University roads/ parking areas.
- 7. The vehicles owned by a specially-abled person or used primarily to transport a specially-abled person shall be allowed to park in the designated 'accessible parking 'lots for unlimited periods or in any parking spaces allotted for faculty, staff, or students except for reserved spaces. Such permits will be free of charge. Such vehicles will be issued a sticker/permit that has to be displayed at all times when the vehicle is parked at the accessible parking space.
- 8. When parking a vehicle, the entire vehicle shall be within marked boundaries of the parking space allotted. Improperly parked vehicles may invite a written caution in the first instance followed by fine of Rs. 50 in the second instance and a fine of Rs. 250 from third instance onwards. Motorbikes shall be parked only in designated spaces allotted for motorbikes. Parking in non-designated spaces or in spaces allocated to other vehicles shall invite a written caution in the first instance followed by fine of Rs. 50 in the second instance and a fine of Rs. 250 from third instance onwards.
- Registered vehicle parked on university parking area not moved/ or used for a period of 30 days shall be deemed abandoned and towed at owner's expense.
- 10. The speed limit on campus at all times shall be 30 km per hour. Speed beyond this limit will invite a written caution in the first instance followed by fine of Rs. 50 in the second instance and a fine of Rs. 100 in third instance and Rs. 250 from fourth instance onwards. Vehicles should drive at a slower speed while crossing the pedestrian walkways, CUK crèche, hostels, and staff quarters. All vehicles should stop at pedestrian crossings to facilitate the movement of pedestrians.

11. Traffic Control

a. No vehicle shall be allowed access to the driveways through the central flag circle. All vehicles should drive through the ring road in front of the academic building from Krishna to Yamuna. Only pedestrians and cycles are allowed into the flag circle area/ Vivekananda circle

- Several driveways will be marked as one-way roads as indicated by signboards. The left side of such roads may be designated as parking spaces for cars/motorcycles
- c. Parking and No parking areas throughout campus will be designated using appropriate fixed and mobile signboards placed in different locations on campus. In case of gatherings, meetings, special events, etc., additional required spaces will be designated by Estate Section/ Security Wing as Parking/ No parking areas using Mobile Sign Boards.

12. Priority on University Roads.

Special-abled Individuals have priority on University roads. When a wheelchair/ wheelchair-bound specially-abled person is in motion on CUK roads/ or in crossings, all vehicles should stop until the wheelchair-bound person has passed or crossed the walkway. Overtaking or crossing a wheelchair-bound person will invite a written caution in the first instance followed by fine of Rs. 100 in the second instance and a fine of Rs 500 from third instance onwards. The fifth instance will result in the cancellation of driving/ parking privileges inside the CUK campus.

- 13. The security staff on campus/ Estate Section will oversee the enforcement of traffic and parking regulations on campus.
- 14. Permit colors.
- Accessible parking permits are blue, and designated spots indicated in blue boundaries
- b. The reserved parking permits are red, and designated spots are indicated in red boundaries with reserved boards displayed at the spot.
- c. The visitor's parking permits are green, and designated spots are indicated in green boundaries.
- d. All other parking spots, including that of motorbikes, are indicated in white boundaries.
- 15. University employees will report promptly in writing any accidents on-campus or off-campus in which they are involved, or any University vehicle is involved detailing the circumstances of accidents and liability involved in the course of their official duties.
- 16. Wherever possible, teachers and students are encouraged to use carpooling, availing of shuttle services, and other means such as cycles to reduce their carbon footprint on the campus.
- 17. All personnel operating motor vehicles/ parking on campus must comply with these regulations.

18. The competent authority may revise these regulations from time to time and inform the University community of the changes.
