EC:03:03:04 Activity Report of Central University of Kerala – from the last Executive Council meeting to 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2017

A six-member National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) team headed by Prof. Jai Roop Singh, former Vice Chancellor, Central University of Punjab, visited different campuses of the Central University of Kerala (CUK) during 23<sup>rd</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2016. They have closely examined the activities of various departments, laboratories, libraries, administrative blocks, and hostels of the University. The team also reviewed on-going Page 1 of 35

construction activities for various academic buildings at its main Periye campus, sports facilities and activities of the other cells on the university campuses. They also had interactive sessions with the students, faculty, alumni, public and parents separately during the visit

As per the assessment of the NAAC team, the University was awarded with a grade of B++ (2.76 CGP) Grading.

Till the assessment of the NAAC Peer Team, the University had appointed 109 faculty members out of a sanctioned strength of 147 faculty members. During 9 – 18 January 2017, the University has conducted faculty interviews for filling up of 15 No. of faculty positions (Professor - 6 Nos. and Associate Professor - 9 Nos.). The minutes of the selection committee meeting will be placed in this meeting as Agenda items.

On the recommendation of the Selection Committee meeting held during 29 – 31 August 2016, Dr. R. Radhakarishnan Nair and Dr. B.R. Prasannakumar have joined as regular Registrar and Finance Officer of the University for a term of 5 years on 17<sup>th</sup> October, 2016 and 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2016, respectively.

Shri. V. Sasidharan, Controller of Examinations of the University, after having completed 5 years of term was relieved of his duties on 02.02.2017 (A/N). Dr. Mohammed Unni Alias Musthafa, Associate Professor, Dept. of Education, has been given the additional charge of the Controller of Examinations. The advertisement inviting applications for the post of Controller of Examinations are also published in the leading newspapers, employment news etc. The same has already been published in the University website also. The last date of submission of applications for the post of Controller of Examinations is 28.02.2017.

The Construction of Academic Buildings and other works are going on One of the academic buildings will be used as administrative block. The details of which will be placed as agenda items, as recommended by the Finance Committee meeting.

During the year 2016, the University has received a total number of 127 RTI applications and answers to these questions have been furnished to the applicants in a time bound manner.

In the meantime, Shri. V. Sasidharan, Controller of Examinations has submitted a representation for extension/renewal of his appointment as per 8(2), 8(3) of Statute of Second Schedule of Central Universities Act, 2009 and provisions 1 and 2 of University Ordinance no. 23(E) (copy enclosed as Annexure VI).

He has also filed a Writ Petition (Civil) No. 2073 of 2017-H before the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in connection with his representation for the renewal of his term as Controller of Examinations for another similar term of five years from 03.02.2017 as per 8(2), 8(3) of Statute of Second Schedule of Central Universities Act 2009 and provisions 1 and 2 of University Ordinance no. 23(E).

	Molecular Biology

 Dr Rajagopal Kammara joined as Professor in the Dept of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology on 09.06.2016 under direct recruitment. He submitted his resignation from Central University of Kerala on health grounds on 13.07.2016. As per the Written Agreement signed by Dr Rajagopal Kammara, three months' notice period was required for acceptance of resignation (Annexure VIII). Clause 25 (6) (a) of the Statutes states that three months' notice period or three months' salary is mandatory for resignation for permanent employees (Annexure IX). Clause 25 (6) (b) of the Statutes mandates one month notice period if the employee is not a permanent employee (Annexure X). Dr Rajagopal Kammara was not ready to pay three months' salary stating that there is no clause of payment of notice period salary for any shortfall in the probation period. He had also stated that the notice period during the probation period is only one month. He had requested to place the case in the Executive Council to waive the requirement of notice period, as mentioned in the Written Agreement.

On 09.08.2016, he submitted a letter stating that he would like to pay the remaining two months' salary and requested to relieve him on 16.08.2016 (AN). The request was approved. He paid two months' salary i.e Rs 2,53,710/- to the University on 10.08.2016. Accordingly, Dr Rajagopal Kammara was relieved from Central University of Kerala on 16.08.2016 (AN).

- 2. A complaint was registered by Dr Rajagopal Kammara in the UGC grievance portal on 28.11.2016 to reimburse two months' salary paid by him stating that the notice period during the probation period is one month only. The matter was referred to the Standing Counsel for legal opinion. Legal opinion received on the subject is placed at (Annexure XI) Based on the legal opinion, a reply was forwarded to UGC as follows:
  - a. As per the Clause 9 of Memorandum of Agreement signed by Dr Rajagopal Kammara, three months' notice period was required for acceptance of resignation. Clause 25(6) (a) of the Statutes also mandates requirement of three months' notice period for permanent employees. Dr Rajagopal Kammara was appointed as a regular employee through direct selection process and not as temporary or provisional.
  - b. Dr Rajagopal Kammara submitted his resignation letter on 13.07.2016. As per the MoA and Statute regarding relieving on resignation, he had to be relieved after three months i.e, w.e.f 13.10.2016. However, his resignation was accepted w.e.f 16.08.2016 (AN) since he had requested to accept the resignation by paying remaining two months' salary.
  - c. Further, with regard to his request for reimbursement of the amount paid considering him as temporary employee since his probation was not cleared, it is stated that declaration of probation will only regularise the service of a person against a permanent post. Every selection process involves a cost for the University. Instant resignation after securing employment is causing heavy financial liability to the University and difficulties to the students. Hence, in order to protect the interest of the University and Students, a period three months' notice period was mandated in the Agreement. However, the Executive Council may waive the requirement of notice period at its discretion.

- d. In view of the above, the request submitted by Dr Rajagopal Kammara for reimbursement of Rs.2,53,710/- paid by him in lieu of two months' salary for acceptance of resignation will be placed before the next Executive Council for consideration as mentioned in Memorandum of Agreement.
- 3. Hence, the request submitted by Dr Rajagopal Kammara to waive the requirement of three months' notice period and to reimburse two months' salary of Rs 2, 53,710/- paid by him is submitted before the Executive Council for consideration.

The age of superannuation of teachers has been enhanced from 62 to 65 years vide MHRD letter No 1-19/2006-U.II dated 23.03.2007. MHRD, vide letter No.F.No.19-45/2016- CU.III dated 31.10.2016 has advised to amend the Statute of the University regarding for enhancement of age of superannuation (enclosed as Annexure XII).

The age of superannuation of teachers is not mentioned in the Statutes of Central University of Kerala. It is proposed to add the same under Statute 22 (Terms and Conditions of service and code of conduct of teachers) as addition of Sl No 5. Draft amendment placed below:-

In anticipation of termination of his service, Shri, Suresh Kumar has approached Hon'ble High Court of Kerala.

The Court has stayed his termination vide order dated 06.06.2014.

On 19.12.2014, the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala gave an interim direction to the University to pay the salary including arrears from 05.02.2014 to Shri. Suresh Kumar. Accordingly, the

University has been paying salary regularly and has been sanctioned periodical increments in 2015, 2016.

In the meantime, on 13.01.2017, Shri. Suresh Kumar had submitted a representation to the Vice Chancellor requesting him to regularise and confirm his service as Driver in the Central University of Kerala. He had also mentioned in his letter that the recruitment rules have been amended by the University with retrospective effect.

Hon'ble High Court of Kerala vide interim order dated 02.02.17 (placed as Annexure XIV) has directed the University/Vice Chancellor to consider the request for regularisation of service as requested by Shri. Suresh Kumar V in his letter dated 13.01.2017.

The Financial bid opening Committee for outsourcing agencies held on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2016 at Registrar's Chamber has recommended that the tender called-for (tender notice no. CUK/ADM/OUTSOURCE-MANPOWER/ 15 dated 28<sup>th</sup> September, 2016), for the selection of the outsourcing agency for manpower was cancelled as the L1 firm (M/s Kite Logistics, Palakkad) could not produce the required original documents for verification as directed on 21st October, 2016 and reminders on 1st and 4th November, 2016. In view of the above, the University could not execute agreement for providing services. The Committee also recommended retendering for outsourcing manpower.

Accordingly, retender process has been initiated. As the retender process may requires one or two month duration, the validity of agreement for outsourcing manpower through M/s Security and Personnel Service has again extended upto 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2017 with the same terms as conditions.

In the meantime, retender process has completed and work order issued to L1 (M/s Gurubani Security Pvt Ltd, Secunderabad- @2.25%) and they have accepted the work order and agreed to take up the service w.e.f 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2017.

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To report the extension of agreement for outsourcing Security Personnel through M/s Security & Personnel Service, Kannur upto 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2017 and re-extension for a further period of three months w.e.f 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2017

Dr. Tony Grace, Assistant Professor, Department of Genomic Science incorporated his mobile No. 8547818453 in the question paper of the Gen-503 Evolutionary Biology examination held on 15/11/2016 conducted by the University affecting purity of examination and bringing disrepute to the University. The matter was reported by the Newspaper.

The Vice Chancellor directed the Controller of Examination to conduct a preliminary investigation in to the allegations on 22/12/16. Accordingly an investigation was conducted by

the Controller of Examinations on the same day, wherein statements of all connected parties including that of Dr. Tony Grace, Assistant Professor, Department of Genomic Science was obtained. Dr. Tony Grace in his statement admitted that his Mobile Number has been incorporated in QP, GEN-503, "Evolutionary Biology" as highest number of Students (156) has been enrolled and it has been conducted in seven class rooms and therefore to clear to queries on questions, the mobile number was incorporated. Incorporating the Mobile Number in the Question paper which is set to be a higher confidential matter in a university and the identity of the question paper setter has been revealed by incorporating the Mobile Number of Dr. Tony Grace, Assistant Professor, Department of Genomic Science and thus has committed serious misconduct.

In all statements, the question of incorporating Mobile Number by Dr. Tony Grace has never been disputed and is an admitted fact. Incorporating Mobile Number in the question paper for Gen-503 Evolutionary Biology examination held on 15/11/2016 conducted by the University brought disrepute to the institution, affecting the purity of examination in violation of instructions issued vide Revised CBCS Regulation for PG programme of Central University of Kerala and CUK Ordinance on Examination and thereby committed serious misconduct unbecoming of a government servant.

In view of the above, the Authority has decided to keep Dr Tony Grace under suspension w.e.f 27.12.2016 since he failed to maintain absolute integrity, devotion to duty and behaved in unbecoming of a Government Servant violating Rule 3(I) (i), (ii) and (iii) of CCS (Conduct) Rules 1964.

Further as per order no. CUK/VCF/Suspension/216/150 dated 06.02.17, the University has revoked his suspension with immediate effect. The Vice Chancellor appointed an Inquiring Authority and Presenting Officer to inquire into the charges framed against Dr. Tony Grace.

The FC agreed in principle the Revised Budget Estimate for the financial year 2016-17 and instructed to keep the expenditure within the mandatory limits of the XII Plan allocation (copy placed as Annexure XXV).

As per the existing policy, Merit Scholarship is being paid to five students in each Department of the University based on the merit @ Rs.1500/- per month. For the first Semester, the merit is considered on the basis of score obtained by the students in the (Central Universities Common Entrance Test) CUCET Examination and in the subsequent semesters, it is assessed on the score in the previous semester examinations.

The University has started the First batch of Master of Public Health & Community Medicine (MPH) in the year 2016 (March 2016) and now the 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester of the course is on-going. We have started the Department of Public Administration and Department of Geology in the month of September 2016 along with other academic courses. The total number of students admitted in the courses of MPH, Public Administration and Geology was 20, 21 and 16 respectively. The University proposed to extend the Merit Scholarship to the students of these departments in uniformity with the students in the other Departments of the University.

a) The Finance Committee deliberated the issue of merit scholarship as above. The comments received from the JS&FA, MHRD on the issue of Merit scholarship was also considered by the F.C and in turn suggested to send the proposal to UGC for granting Merit scholarship to the students of Department of Public Health & Community Medicine, Department of Public Administration and Department of Geology. The proposal should be according to the guidelines and existing scheme should also be reviewed based on the guidelines in this regard. The Committee suggested that the merit scholarship should be limited to the University Rank Holders as per the UGC guidelines. In addition to this an effort should be made to get CSR support for extending the scheme of merit scholarship.

b) At present the merit scholarship is @ Rs.1,500/- per student per department per semester for five students. The status quo in case of merit scholarship will be maintained up to 2016-18 Academic year except for three departments mentioned at (a) above. From 2017 academic year onwards scholarship will be completely governed as per UGC guidelines.

The Executive Council kindly consider the proposal recommended by the Finance Committee.

The Executive Council vide Resolution EC:02:12:14 dated 03.07.2015 had approved construction of Multi-Purpose Hall consisting of Four Wheeler Parking, Library, Women's rest room, store etc. at an estimated cost of Rs.2,04,53,127/- The work being executed through the PMC holder M/s. RITES Ltd. During execution, some additional works amounting to Rs.18,23,747/- were found necessary and this has resulted in increase of cost of construction from Rs.2,04,53,127/- to Rs.2,22,76,874/-.

The Building Committee meeting held on 08.09.2016 considered and approved the additional works involved and recommended to FC for according revised sanction as above. When this proposal was placed in the 1<sup>st</sup> Meeting of the 3<sup>rd</sup> F.C held on 22-9-2016 at Kerala House, New Delhi, as an agenda item No. 03:01:07(iv), the F.C has directed to bring the item before the next meeting of the F.C with detailed explanatory notes and comparative statement.

The FC scrutinized the comments from JS&FA, MHRD on this proposal. As per the comments received from MHRD " the relevant details / documents for revised cost-estimates, as per the guidelines issued by UGC have not been made available. Complete details, component- wise for the Original Cost Estimate and Revised Cost estimate need to be examined to ensure that it is within the permissible limits. Also, it has not been spelt out as to why the changes in scope and design of the project (s) have subsequently been made, if the detailed layout, architectural plan and structural designs had been firmed up at the time of according the administrative and financial sanctions."

The FC examined the proposal for additional expenditure of Rs. 18,24 lakh for the construction of Multi-Purpose Hall, which was found necessary during the execution resulting in an increase of total cost of construction from Rs.2,04,53,127/- to Rs.2,22,76,874/-, along with the revised estimate, reasons for revision of estimate, detailed explanatory note and comparative statement and the Building Committee resolution in this regard.

The F.C agreed to the proposal since the work has already been completed and the additional expenditure of Rs.18.24 lakhs is within the permissible limit of 10% of the financial sanction as per the CPWD manual.

The F.C recommended the proposal for additional expenditure of Rs. 18.24 lakh (Rs.18,23,747/-) for approval of the E.C.

The F.C deliberated on the additional expenditure involved in the construction of the 16 independent houses for shifting Malathumpara Colony. The F.C perused the estimate for Rs.4,05,04,726/- and noted that the increase in the scope of the work was necessitated due to the State Govt.'s intervention, by accepting the demands of the Colony people from time to time. The original cost of the work was Rs.2,84,22,000/- and the revised estimate is Rs.4,05,04,726/-. The additional works has seen finalized based on the discussion with the revenue authorities of the State Govt. The F.C noted that the introduction of a new agency for executing the additional works as per the revised estimates when the work is already in progress is not practically possible. In view of the above and since the proposal for additional works came from the funding agency i.e the State Govt. of Kerala, and enhanced expenditure as per the revised estimate of Rs.4,05,04,726/- will be within the funds sanctioned by the Govt. of Kerala for this purpose.

The F.C agreed to the proposal and recommended to the E.C for revised administrative sanction and expenditure sanction for Rs.4,05,04,726/- as proposed.

As per the original Plan for construction of academic buildings, there are 16 academic blocks; one block for each department with an estimated cost of Rs.463.75Cr. The list of 16 blocks and its estimated cost as approved by the E.C was examined by the F.C. It is noted that all the buildings are originally designed as G + 4 -structure, keeping in view the future requirements of

the departments. But, as per the comments of the UGC to undertake the construction according to the availability of funds communicated by UGC vide letter No. F.76-11/2013(CU) dated. 05.02.2015, the University had started construction of only 8 academic blocks (4 blocks with G + 1 structure and 4 blocks with G + 2 structure) in October 2015, with an estimated cost of Rs.189.72Cr. The Executive Engineer Shri K.G.Rajagopal explained that the construction work is in progress.

As per the present construction, one G+1 building is purely earmarked for Administrative block and therefore existing 14 departments can only be accommodated in the remaining buildings. Also, presently the University has 20 departments in Kasaragod, out of which, 3 departments will be in the semi-permanent buildings and other 3 departments will remain in the rented premises even after the completion of the present construction of the 8 academic buildings. So in order to accommodate all the departments within the new buildings under construction and to avoid rented buildings the University has to alter 4 number of G+2 building into G+4 (All buildings are designed for G+4 structure). This will enable the University to save considerable amount being paid as rent, transportation charges, electricity etc. The University now spread out in 4 campuses at Kasaragod can be brought into one campus, which is an administrative necessity also. According to which it is proposed to construct two more additional floors for four Science Department buildings. The F.C examined the estimate cost of the vertical extension which will be Rs.35.35 Crore only as per the estimate submitted by RITES.

The Exe-Engineer also informed that, there would be a savings of Rs.22.17 Crores with reference to the sanctioned amount and the tender value in respect of the 8 academic buildings now under construction. A comparative statement showing estimated cost and savings also produced before the F.C. The F,C has also noted the accrued interest of approximately Rs.7 crore can also be utilized for the purpose of vertical extension and the remaining portions of the fund requirements, if any can be met from the next year's allocation.

The F.C examined the revised estimate and statement of savings along with the communication from M/s RITES Ltd. and deliberated the matter in detail. The F.C noted that construction of two additional floors as proposed above shall obviate the need for undertaking capital works worth Rs.274/- crore earlier planned. Moreover, the University will not be required to undertake any new construction until UGC sanction new academic departments, if the present vertical extension is carried out. The F.C also noted that while undertaking the present construction of academic buildings there will be a saving of Rs.29.17 crore and that not much additional funds are required for the vertical extension now proposed. Therefore the F.C agreed to the proposal of vertical extension of 4 academic buildings now under construction subject to the work being carried out as per the CPWD manual and GFR provisions.

Accordingly, F.C recommended the proposal for vertical extension of four academic buildings for Rs.35.35/- crore for administrative approval and expenditure sanction of the E.C.

Based on our request, Kerala Water Authority has submitted a detailed project report for the implementation of drinking water supply scheme for the exclusive use of University amounting to Rs10.50 Crores. Now we have received Administrative and Financial sanction for the above work from the Govt. of Kerala vide G O.Rt. 2514/2016/HEDN dated 22.09.2016 and G.O (Rt.) No. 9104/2016/Fin dated 21.11.2016. For the effective implementation of the above project, we have to construct an intake well cum Pump house in Karichery River at Munnamkadavu near the bridge. In addition to which an approach road from the Periya – Munnamkadavu road to the intake well and pump house has also to be constructed. For these purposes, the University has to acquire about 25 cents (approx.) from the private property in R.S. no. 313/2 of Periya Village owned by Smt. Fareeda W/o Ismail Moonnamkadavu. The purchase of the above private land can be done at the prevailing rate fixed by the Revenue Department, Govt. of Kerala, utilizing the State Govt, funds.

The following remarks in this regard has been received from the JS & FA, MHRD:

"As per the existing Government of India Policy on the subject; land for the University has to be made by the State Government free of cost and without any encumbrances. It is not within the competence of any of the statutory body of the University to take any decision to the contrary. Resettlement of settlers is the sole responsibility of the State Government and the question of incurring any expenditure in this regard does not arise. Financial implication on the purchase has also not been clearly indicated.

Since, there is no clarity on the subject; the proposal is not supported for approval. In case any further clarification is needed, the matter may be referred to UGC / MHRD for specific advice."

The F C deliberated the issue and came to the conclusion that the purchase of 25 cent of land at the prevailing rate fixed by the Revenue Department is for the water supply scheme of the University, fully funded by the State Govt. and no cost is involved on the part of the University or UGC.

Therefore the F.C considered the proposal and recommended to the E.C for approval.

The Minutes of the Eleventh Meeting of the Second Finance Committee held on 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 has resolved to reduce the hostel rent from Rs.3000/- to Rs.2500/- per Student per Semester. The Finance Committee also resolved to enhance the hostel rent in every three years @ 10% of the existing amount rounded to nearest multiple of ten rupees.

Since there was a difference in the resolutions of the Executive Council and the Finance Committee, the matter was referred to the MHRD twice vide letter No. CUK/VCF-1/2016/1308 dated September 28, 2016 and 23<sup>rd</sup> November, 2016. A copy of the resolution of the Executive Council and the letters addressed to the MHRD.

The Executive Council being the Principal Executive body of the University, the resolution of the Executive Council to reduce the hostel rent from Rs.3000/- to Rs.2000/- has been already implemented.

However, the JS&FA,MHRD communicated that the decision of the E.C is not to be ratified.

While noting the agenda item, the F.C wanted to reiterate the UGC instructions and guidelines issued from time to time with regard to the need for generating additional internal revenue by the University.

The EC may reiterate and confirm the resolution of reduction of hostel rent from Rs.3,000/- to Rs.2,000/- per student per semester (vide 15<sup>th</sup> meeting of 2<sup>nd</sup> EC dated 20.03,2016)

The Finance Committee meeting held on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2017 also reiterated (FC: 03.03.11) (Copy placed as Annexure XXIX) the aspect. The reduced generation of revenue hinders much of University's development activities.

At present the sources of revenue for the University are overhead charges (10%) of the project costs, sale of tender forms, sale of usufructs from the University land trees, amount of application fees of various recruitments conducted, sale amount of scrap/obsolete items and admission fees and hostel rent collected from the Students.

The scope for major chunk of revenue generation is from the students' fee portion. The Students' fee was last hiked during July, 2014. It is proposed to effect the minimum hike of all compulsory fee by 10% from the existing (including Hostel fee) w.e.f. the academic year 2017-18 onwards.

The Executive Council may consider.

## EC:03:03:48 To take decision on continuing the Merit Scholarship Scheme

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Finance Committee in its first meeting has directed the University to regulate University Merit Scholarship as per the UGC norms and Govt. of India directions. It may be noted that UGC is not supporting any Merit Scholarship Scheme other than UGC Non-Net Fellowship.

UGC has a scheme for meritorious scholarship for the students who have achieved 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> rank in their first degree examination for pursing PG studies (Scheme attached as Annexure XXX). Central University of Kerala may replace the Merit Scholarship to Merit Scholarship Scheme for University Rank Holders from the Academic Year 2017-18 onwards. Necessary corrections will be made in the brochure also.

Thereafter, the agenda items were taken up for discussion.



Observance of punctuality in Government Offices.

Instructions have been issued from time to time with regard to the need to observe punctuality by Government servants. Responsibility for ensuring punctuality in respect of their employees rests within Ministries/ Departments/ Offices.

- 2. The decision to introduce AADHAR enabled Bio-metric Attendance System (AEBAS) in Central Government offices, including attached/sub-ordinate offices, to replace the manual system of marking of attendance to ensure punctuality is to be implemented in all Ministries/ Departments. This Department vide O.M. of even no. dated 21.11.2014 and 28.01.2015, while recognizing that the Biometric Attendance System is only an enabling platform had, inter-alia, stated that there was no change in the instructions relating to office hours, late attendance etc.
  - 3. In this connection attention is invited to Rule 3(1)(ii) of CCS (Conduct) Rules, 1964 which stipulates that every Government servant shall at all times maintain devotion to duty. Habitual late attendance is viewed as conduct unbecoming of a Government servant and disciplinary action may be taken against such a Government servant. It is also added that punctuality in attendance is to be observed by Government servants at all levels.

4. It is also requested that the necessary directions may be issued to all employees to mark their attendance in BAS portal on regular basis.



Attendance System (AEBAS) in all offices of the Central Government, including attached/ sub-ordinate Offices, in India. The system will be installed in the offices located in Delhi/ New Delhi by 31st December 2014. In other places this may be installed by 26th January 2015

- The equipment will be procured by the Ministries/ Departments as per specifications of DeitY on DGS&D Rate Contract from authorized vendors. The expenditure will be met by the Ministries/ Departments concerned under their O.E. The manual system of attendance may be phased out accordingly.
- 3. The Department of Electronics and Information Technology (DeitY) will provide the technical guidance for installing the system. The equipment already procured by DeitY have a built in AMC of three years. The Ministries/ departments may ensure that the equipment being procured by them have similar provision.
- 4. Biometric attendance system is only an enabling platform. There is no change in the instructions relating to office hours, late attendance etc. which will continue to apply. As per extant instructions, (contained in DoPT O.M. No: 28034/8/75- Estt-A dated 04-07-1975; No:28034/10/75-Estt-A dated 27-08-1975; No: 28034/3/82 -Estt-A dated 05-03-1982) half-a-day's Casual Leave should be debited for each day of late attendance, but late attendance upto an hour, on not more than two occasions in a month, and for justifiable reasons may be condoned by the competent authority. In addition to debiting Casual Leave (or Earned Leave, when no CL is available). Disciplinary action may also be taken against government

Accordingly I have been serving the University as Controller of Examinations, since 03.02,2012. My five year term as Controller of Examinations will expire on 02.02.2017.

Central Universities Act 2009 along with Second Schedule has been enacted by the Parliament and has received the assent of the Visitor on 20th March 2009.

Accordingly various Central Universities derived, framed and adopted their Ordinances on different matters, fully adhering to letter and spirit of the relevant provisions of the Act and Statute.

The 8(2), 8(3) of Statute of Second Schedule of Central Universities Act 2009 reads as:-

# The Second Schedule, the Statutes of the University

- 8(2). The Controller of Examinations shall be appointed for a term of five years and shall be eligible for re-appointment.
- 8(3). The emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Controller of Examinations shall be such as may be prescribed by the Executive Council from time to time:

Provided that the Controller of Examinations shall retire on attaining the age of sixty two years.

Provisions 1 and 2 of the University Ordinance No: 23(E), Emoluments, Terms & Conditions of Service Of The Controller Of Examinations reads as:-





Memorandum of Agreement made this the day of 09th June, 2016 between Dr. K Rajagopal (hereinafter called the 'Teacher') of the first part and the Central University of Kerala being a body corporate constituted under the Central Universities Act, 2009 as amended vide the Central Universities (Amendment) Ordinance, 2009 replaced by an Act of Parliament (hereinafter called the University) of the second part. It is hereby agreed as follows:

1. That the University hereby appoint Dr. K Rajagopal to be a member of teaching staff in the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology of the University with effect from the date of joining, 09th June, 2016 the said takes charge of the duties of here post of Professor and the said, Dr. K Rajagopal hereby accepts the engagement and undertakes to take such part in the activities of the University and perform such duties in the University as may be required and in accordance with the said Act, the Statutes and Ordinances framed there under, for the time being in force, whether the same relate to organization in instruction or teaching, or research or the examination of students or their discipline or their welfare, and generally to act under the direction of the authorities of the University.

2. (a) The teacher shall be on probation for a period of 12 months which may be extended by a further period of 12 months. The total period of probation shall in no

case exceed twenty four months.

- (b) The case of each teacher shall be placed before the Executive Council for confirmation soon after the expiry of the period of probation prescribed that is within six to eight weeks. The decision of the Executive Council with regard to his/her confirmation or extension of his/her probation period, should be communicated to the teacher immediately\*.
- (c) If the University is satisfied with the suitability of the teacher for confirmation he/she shall be confirmed on the post to which he/she was appointed at the end of the period of his/her probation.
- (d) Where a teacher appointed on probation is found, during the period of probation, not suitable for holding that post or has not completed the period of probation whether extended or not, satisfactorily, the Executive Council may (i) if the appointment is by direct recruitment, terminate the teacher's service from the University without notice; (ii) if the appointment is by promotion, revert the incumbent to previous post held by him.
- 3. That the said, shall be a whole-time teacher of the University and unless the contract is terminated by the Executive Council or by the teacher as hereinafter provided, shall continue in the service of the University until he/she completes the age of sixty five years.
- 4. That the University shall pay, during the continuance of his/her engagement hereunder as remuneration for his/her service a Pay of Rs. 34700-67000+AGP of Rs 10,000/- per mensem, raising by annual increment @ Rs.3% of Pay + AGP rounded to next 10 rupees. In addition, he/she will be entitled to other allowances as admissible under rules from time to time.

Provided further that no increment shall be withheld or postponed save by resolution of the Executive Council on a reference by the Vice-Chancellor to it and after the teacher has been given sufficient opportunity to make his/her written representation.

Provided that whenever there is any change in the nature of the appointment or the emoluments of the teacher, the terms of the agreement shall apply mutatis mutandis to the new salary and post and the terms and conditions attached to that post.

5. That the said teacher agrees to be bound by the Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and Rules for the time being in force in the University, provided that no change in the terms and conditions of service of the teacher shall be made after his/her appointment in regard to designation, scale of pay, increment, provident fund, retirement benefits, age of retirement, probation, confirmation, leave salary and removal from service so as to adversely affect him/her.

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- 6. That the teacher shall devote his/her whole-time to the service of the University and shall not, without the written permission of the University, engage directly or indirectly in any trade or business whatsoever, or in any private tuition or other work to which any emolument or honorarium is attached by this prohibition shall not apply to work undertaken in connection with the examination of Universities or learned bodies or Public Service Commission, or to any literary work or publication or radio talk or extension lectures, or, with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, to any other academic work.
- 7. It is further agreed that this engagement shall not be liable to be terminated by the University except on the grounds specified and in accordance with the procedure laid down in Clauses (i) to (vi), reproduced below:
  - (i) Where there is an allegation of misconduct against a teacher or a member of the academic staff, the Vice-Chancellor may, if he thinks fit by order in writing, place the teacher under suspension and shall forthwith report to the Executive Council the circumstances in which the order was made:
  - (ii) Provided that the Executive Council may, if it is of the opinion that the circumstances of the case do not warrant the suspension of the teacher or the member of the academic staff, revoke that order.
  - (iii) Notwithstanding anything contained in the terms of her contract of service or of her appointment, the Executive Council shall be entitled to remove a teacher or a member of the academic staff on the ground of misconduct.
  - (iv) Save as aforesaid, the Executive Council shall not be entitled to remove a teacher or a member of the academic staff except for good cause and after giving three months notice in writing or on payment of three months salary in lieu of notice.
- (v) No teacher or a member of the academic staff shall be removed under clause (ii) or under clause (iii) until she has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against her.
- (vi) The removal of a teacher or a member of the academic staff shall require a two-thirds majority of the members of the Executive Council present and voting.
- (vii) The removal of a teacher or a member of the academic staff shall take effect from the date on which the order of removal is made;

Provided that where a teacher or a member of the academic staff is under suspension at the time of removal, the removal shall take effect from the date on which she was placed under suspension.

- Any dispute arising out of this contract shall be settled in accordance with the provisions of the Central University of Kerala.
- The teacher may, at any time, terminate his/her engagement by giving three months' notice in writing, provided that the Executive Council may waive the requirement of notice at its discretion.



On the termination of the engagement for whatever cause, the teacher shall deliver to the University all books, apparatus, records and such other articles belonging to the University as may be due from him/her.

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

#### LEGAL OPINION

Sub:- Legal Opinion Letter dated 28/12/2016 Dr. Rajagopal Kammari - Reg:-

I have gone through the letter dated 28/12/2016 and the anteceden records attached therewith.

As per clause 9 of the agreement a resignation is permitted only by giving 3 months notice with enough discretion to the Executive council to waive the requirement of notice.

The discretion has to be exercised fairly and reasonably in appropriate cases, based on the materials on record. Other than the oral assertions made by Dr. Rajagopal Kammara, there is no material to substantiate that he requires some concessions from the Executive Council in that regard. However in case he produces materials in support of his claim, matter can be left for the consideration of Executive Council.

Question to be decided is which provision in the statute to be applied in given facts of the case. From the records it is clear that Shri. Dr. Rajagopa Kammara was appointed as a permanent employee of the University through direct selection process. The selection was not for any temporary or provisional purpose. Since selection was against a permanent post through a direct recruitment process, the section 25 (6) (a) need to be invoked in the facts of the case. In my opinion Section 25(6)(b) of the statute would be applicable only for such employees who were not appointed permanently.

Superannuation of teachers at the age of 65 years - reg. Subject:-

M/o HRD vide its letter No. 1-19/2006-U.II dated 23.3 2007 addressed to University Grants Commission (UGC), enhanced the age of superannuation of teachers from 62 to 65 years in the centrally funded higher and technical institutions under this Ministry. Subsequently, UGC vide its letter dated 4.4.2007 addressed to the Registrars of all the Central/Deemed Universities had requested them to comply with the MHRD's letter dated 23.3.2007. Accordingly most of the CUs have rhanced the age of superannuation of teachers from 62 to 65 years.

- However, it is noticed that the CUs have not amended their Statute, which necessarily should have been done by way of getting the approval from the Visitor before entrancing the age of superannuation of teachers.
- You are requested to confirm whether the Statute of your University has been amended while enhancing the age of superanguation of teachers. This may be treated as Urgent.

### PREFACE

Malayalam has been achieved its status of classical language by the citations such as the back dated documents of 1500 years older and other relicts of classical writings, history, pedigree, wealth of older literature etc ... The researches regarding to identify Malayalam as a classical language, led to many new findings of a primitive status of its strength. Among these, the most relevant citation is the fact that, Malayalam has been used in written text dated more than 2000 years back, which is older than what we had considered until now. Malayalam language's historical progress or growth could be divided by four phases, which is being discussed below:

First Phase: Proto Tamil; Malayalain Classical age - this age was up to 800 AD. In this age we can see many modes of Malayalam language acquisition. As such the wellknown Malainattuvazhakkangal in some important writings as Pathituppathu, Ainkkurunooru, Pazhamtamilpattu of Keraleeyar and Chilappathikaaram, and other

extracts are Pulimankompu, Edakkal, Pattanam, Nilampoor Likhithangal, Vazhthukkal regarding the Kaliseva, Four Padhas of Yathrakkaly are the derived form of Malayalam language in the first phase.

Second Phase: Ancient Malayalam Classical age - since 800 AD up to 1300 AD was considered this phase. Near about 200 different documents Vattezhuthu and in some degree of Grandha Lipy, Aattaprakaram, Kramadeepika, Bhaashakaudaleeyam, Paattu, Manipravaalakrithikal, and the written prose thesis are the literatures of this age of both verse and prose.

Third Phase: Medieval Malayalam Classical age - since 1300 AD up to 1600 AD was considered this phase. This could be concluded as the evolutionary phase of Malayalam literary strata, in which there are many new experiments in literature such as Kannassakrithikal, Krishnagaadha, Ramayanamchampu. The most important among them are the Bhashaabhagavatgeetha and Krishnagaadha. This age witnessed the make shift of The Malayalam Lipy or scripts(Aarya ezhuthu) from Grandha scripts. Today's Malayalam script is the modern version of the old Grandha script. The oldest prose writing by this new Malayalam scripts is known as Daivayogambhasha. It was written in the age of AD 1521. This precious work of prose is being kept in the library of Oriental research Institute and Manuscripts Library of Kerala University under the catalogue no: C/1703.

Fourth Phase: Modern Malayalam age- since 1600 AD is considered this phase. This age was prompted by the cultural evolution of the most eminent poet, our Thunchath Ezhuthachan known as "Puthumalayanmathan Maheswaran". "Namukkezhuthachanedutha Bhashakramakkanakke saranam" is the status and

standard of Malayalam language which is in high ranking since his articulated activism

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in this classical language.

The first message propagated in Malayalam language against caste system, equal status for women in society, vision with mission for the quality education, and the duty and goal of all human entity were some of his activities through which he reformed

Keralites by his illustrious life.

### VISION

Language is the greatest of all wealth a man acquired. Mother tongue is not only our historical and cultural heritage but also our life and future, which we should qualify for. A civilized society does not have an identity without an active language. We should realize it for the empowerment of our language for which we have to establish a Centre for Classical Language And Literature. And also should print and publish Dictionaries, Handbooks, reference books etc., for the benefit of the academic community. They should be allowed to take copies of all literature too.

#### PROPOSAL

As Malayalam language has got the status of Classical language, it is the responsibility the Central University of Kerala to establish a Centre for Malayalam Language with paramount importance at the earliest. The Centre should later be developed to a School with appropriate planning and implementation of relevant programmes.

The status of classical language offers many possibilities for the development of Malayalam Language. Each Central University will be providing a chair on Classical Language hereafter. The Central Government will release adequate funds in this regard too.

So the Central University of Kerala hereby proposes to establish a Centre for Classical Malayalam Language in 2016 itself. The Centre may be named after Sree Vidyadhiraja Chattampi Swamikal, an extra ordinary saint and scholar, who is the father of academic research in Malayalam Language, Kerala Culture, Kerala History, Place Names, and many other disciplines associated with the day to day life of Keralites. His authoritative books on different fields of knowledge like *Pracheenamalayalam*, *Aadibhasha*, *Vedaadhiakaaraniroopanam*, *Advaithachinthapadhathi*, etc., clearly prove the justification of giving his name for the Centre.

As the extra ordinary saint- scholar had born in the capital city, the Centre should provide a memorial establishment in Thiruvananthapuram, where the school of Cultural studies of Central University of Kerala has been set up in the Capital Centre at present. The facilities of Oriental Research Institute and Manuscripts Library, the Dravidian

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Linguistics Academy, Centenary Libraries like the Central (Public) library, SreeChithirathirunal Library Vanchiyoor, Ulloor Library, Jagathy, Kerala University Library, etc., could be utilized for research and other activities of the Centre in Thiruvananthapuram. More over there is not even a single official Institution has been established yet in the memory of Chattampi Swamikal in his birth place, that is,

Thiruvananthapuram. So this will be a real justice if the Central University of Kerala would establish the Vidyadhiraja Centre for Classical Language in Thiruvananthapuram. It may be noted that the jurisdiction of the Centre should spread over not only in Kerala, but the places where Malayalam language is used and Malayali people live all over the world also.

In order to establish the Sree Vidyadhiraja Centre for Classical Malayalam Language, 8 permanent post, 6 posts on contract/ part-time/ outsourcing basis and 12Fellowships may be sanctioned in the Central University of Kerala with immediate effect.

1) 1Professor and Director

Qualifications-

Minimum- As per the UGC norms of a Professor of Malayalam.

Essential – One year administrative and supervisory experience in editing, printing and publishing in a Government institution other than educational institutions in not below the rank of an Assistant Director.

2) 1 Publication officer

Qualifications and Scale of Pay - Equivalent to that of an Assistant Professor of Malayalam.

Essential - Proficiency in Mass Communication and Journalism.

3) 1 Documentation officer

Qualifications and Scale of Pay - Equivalent to that of an Assistant -- Professor of Malayalam.

Essential - Technical knowledge on Information Technology
Management.

4) 1 Assistant Librarian

Qualification and Scale of Pay - As per UGC norms.

Essential - Research experience and good knowledge in Malayalam



Hence the leave of absence sought for was granted.

The Committee scrutinized the agenda notes along with the clarifications and their modifications suggested on the original agenda and considered the original agenda notes along with the modifications for discussion.

FC:03:03:01 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 1st Meeting of the Third Finance Committee

The Finance Committee perused and confirmed the minutes of the first meeting of 3<sup>rd</sup> Finance Committee held on 22.09.2016 and approved as rented. It has specifically been noted that the comments forwarded by the JS&FA, MHRD have been incorporated under items No. 3:1:1 and 3:1:07(v).

FC:03:03:02 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the Third Finance Committee

The committee perused the minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the 3<sup>nd</sup> F.C conducted by circulation for adopting the Annual Accounts at the University for the financial year 2015-16 along with the Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller &Auditor General of India. While confirming the minutes, the Hon'ble member Shri K.Vijayakumaran opined that the Annual Accounts of the University ought to have been rectified with appropriate correction entries based on the objections raised by the C&AG of India in the draft Separate Audit Report. The stand taken by the University was that the queries in the Separate Audit Report were properly replied and the reply furnished to the C&AG has been incorporated in the Annual Accounts 2015-16 along with SAR. The practical difficulty of correcting the accounts already approved by the Finance Committee and Executive Council based on the subsequent comments on the approved Annual Accounts has been brought to the notice of the Committee. In case the Accounts once approved by the EC are corrected, the Annual Accounts so corrected has to be resubmitted to the PC and EC for approval for submission to the C&AG for getting re-audited. However, the Hon'ble member Shri K.Vijayakumaran suggested that the rectification of the Accounts based on the draft SAR is the correct procedure and the revised accounts along with the Final SAR could be submitted for approval by the FC and EC. It is suggested that this procedure should be followed while finalizing the next year's Annual Accounts and SAR. The F.C resolved the issue accordingly and confirmed the minutes of the 2st meeting of the 3<sup>rd</sup> F.C.

The F.C after going through the Action Taken Report of the 1st meeting of the 3rd Finance Committee held on 22.09.2016, approved the same.

The Finance Committee scrutinized the Revised Budget for the financial Year 2016-17. The Finance Officer explained—the—financial position of the University and the availability of funds for utilization during the XII Plan period. The FC agreed in principle the Revised-Budget-Estimate for the financial year 2016-17 and instructed to keep the expenditure within the mandatory limits of the XII Plan allocation. The FC recommended the revised budget for the financial year 2016-17 to the E.C for approval.

The F.C after detailed scrutiny of the Budget Proposal for the financial year 2017-18 agreed the Budget in - principle subject to availability of funds that will be allocated by UGC for the FY 2017-18.

As per the existing policy, Merit Scholarship is being paid to five students in each Department of the University based on the merit @ Rs.1500/- per month. For the first Semester, the merit is considered on the basis of score obtained by the students in the (Central Universities Common Entrance Test) CUCET Examination and in the subsequent semesters, it is assessed on the score in the previous semester examinations.

The University has started the First batch of Master of Public Health & Community Medicine (MPH) in the year 2016 (March 2016) and now the 2<sup>rd</sup> Semester of the course is ongoing. We have started the Department of Public Administration and Department of Geology in the month of September 2016 along with other academic courses. The total number of students admitted in the courses of MPH, Public Administration and Geology was 20, 21 and 16 respectively. The University proposed to extend the Merit Scholarship to the students of these departments in uniformity with the students in the other Departments of the University.

The Finance Committee deliberated the issue of merit scholarship as above. The comments received from the IS&FA, MHRD on the issue of Merit scholarship was also considered by the F.C and in turn suggested to send the proposal to UGC for granting Merit scholarship to the students of Department of Public Health&Community Medicine, Department of Public Administration and Department of Geology. The proposal should be according to the guidelines and existing scheme should also be reviewed based on the guidelines in this regard. The Committee suggested that the merit scholarship should be limited to the University Rank Holders as per the UGC guidelines. In addition to this an effort should be made to get CSR support for extending the scheme of merit scholarship.

FC:03:03:07(i	To consider approval for an additional expenditure of Rs. 18.24 lakh for Construction of Multipurpose hall Consisting of Four wheeler parking Central Library, Women's rest room, Store etc.
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The Executive Council vide Resolution EC:02:12:14 dated 03.07,2015 had approved construction of Multi-Purpose Hall consisting of Four Wheeler Parking, Library, Women's rest room, store etc. at an estimated cost of Rs.2.04,53,127/s. The work being executed through the PMC holder M/s. RITES Ltd. resulted in increase of cost of construction from Rs.2,04,53,127/s to Rs.2,22,76,874/s.

"MINUTES OF THE THIRD MESTING OF THE THIRD F.C OF CENTRAL UNIVESITY OF HERRLA HELD ON 27:1.2017

The Building Committee meeting held on 03.09.2016 considered and approved the additional works involved and recommended to FC for according revised sanction as above. When this proposal was placed in the 1<sup>st</sup> Meeting of the 3<sup>rd</sup> F.C held on 22-9-2016 at Kerala House, New Delhi, as an agenda item No. 03:01:07(iv), the F.C has directed to bring the item before the next meeting of the F.C with detailed explanatory notes and comparative statement.

The FC scrutinized the comments from IS&FA, MHRD on this proposal. As per the comments received from MHRD "the relevant details / documents for revised cost-estimates, as per the guidelines issued by UGC have not been made available. Complete details, component-wise for the Original Cost Estimate and Revised Cost estimate need to be examined to ensure that it is within the permissible limits. Also, it has not been spelt out as to why the changes in scope and design of the project (s) have subsequently been made, if the detailed layout, architectural plan and structural designs had been firmed up at the time of according the administrative and financial sanctions."

The FC examined the proposal for additional expenditure of Rs. 18,24 lakh for the construction of Multi-Purpose Hall, which was found necessary during the execution resulting in an increase of total cost of construction from Rs.2,04,53,127/- to Rs.2,22,76,874/-, along with the revised estimate, reasons for revision of estimate, detailed explanatory note and comparative statement and the Building Committee resolution in this regard. The F.C agreed to the proposal since the work has already been completed and the additional expenditure of Rs.18.24 lakhs is within the permissible limit of 10% of the financial sanction as per the CPWD manual. The F.C recommended the proposal for additional expenditure of Rs. 18.24 lakh (Rs.18,23,747/-) for approval of the E.C.

FC:03:03:07(ii)	To consider for approval of the proposal for revised estimate for the construction of 16 Independent Houses for shifting Malathumpara colony, inside the University Campus utilizing State Government Fund.
	inside the University Campus tutteing distribution

The F.C deliberated on the additional expenditure involved in the construction of the 16 independent houses for shifting Malathumpara Colony. The F.C perused the estimate for Rs.4,05,04,726/- and noted that the increase in the scope of the work was necessitated due to the State Govt,'s intervention, by accepting the demands of the Colony people from time to time. The original cost of the work was Rs.2,84,22,000/- and the revised estimate is Rs.4,05,04,726/-. The additional works has seen finalized based on the discussion with the revenue authorities of the State Govt. The F.C noted that the introduction of a new agency for executing the additional works as per the revised estimates when the work is already in progress is not practically possible. In view of the above and since the proposal for additional works came from the funding agency i.e the State Govt, of Kerala, and enhanced expenditure as per the revised estimate of Rs.4,05,04,726/- will be within the funds sanctioned by the Govt, of Kerala for this purpose, the F.C agreed to the proposal and recommended to the E.C for revised administrative sanction and expenditure sanction for Rs.4,05,04,726/- as proposed.

FC:03:03:07(iii)	To approve and finalize the PMC charges for other works - ITEM DROPPED
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For M/s. RITES Ltd., as per the E.C. Resolution Vide Item No. EC:02:13:32 (vii) and dated 27.10.2015, the approved PMC charges for development works is 3.90 % and for design charges in respect of Development works is 1 %.

M/s. RITES Ltd. has demanded an additional 1.5% of the construction cost for design of new works not involved in the normal development works. (i.e. 1 % in respect of design involved in normal Development Works and 1.5% for design for any new work not involved in normal Development Work).

The Building Committee meeting held on 08,09,2016 considered the request submitted by the PMC holder M/s. RITES Ltd. regarding the Design fees for other building works which are not a part of the proposed Development works.

Accordingly, the Building Committee agreed to the design fee proposed by M/s, RITES Ltd as 1.50 % ( for Design of new works) in addition to their normal PMC charges of 3.90 %. The Committee also recommended that these rates have to be applicable in respect of the proposed works related to the overhead tank and the sump and that it be brought before the Finance Committee for Administrative Approval and Expenditure situation.

The F.C examined the proposal along with the comments from the JS & FA of the MHRD that the PMC charges cannot be increased through negotiations as it is violative of the relevant provisions of the GFR and CVC Guidelines. Therefore the F.C. rejected and dropped the agenda item.

FC:03:03:07(iv)	To consider Administrative approval and Expenditure sanction for
	vertical extension for 4 Academic Buildings under construction, in lieu
	of horizontal construction of remaining blocks.

As per the original Plan for construction of academic buildings, there are 16 academic blocks; one block for each department with an estimated cost of Rs.463.75Cr. The list of 16 blocks and its estimated cost as approved by the E.C was examined by the F.C. It is noted that all the buildings are originally designed as G+4-structure, keeping in view the future requirements of the departments. But, as per the comments of the UGC to undertake the construction according to the availability of funds communicated by UGC vide letter No. F.76-11/2013(CU) dated. 05.02.2015, the University had started construction of only 8 academic blocks (4 blocks with G + 1 structure and 4 blocks with G + 2 structure) in October 2015, with an estimated cost of Rs.189.72Cr. The Executive Engineer Shri K.G.Rajagopal explained that the construction work is in progress.

As per the present construction, one G+I building is purely earmarked for Administrative block and therefore existing 14 departments can only be accommodated in the remaining buildings. Also, presently the University has 20 departments in Kasaragod, out of which, 3 departments will be in the semi-permanent buildings and other 3 departments will remain in the reuted premises even after the completion of the present construction of the 8 academic-buildings. So in order to accommodate all the departments within the new buildings under construction and to avoid rented buildings the University has to after 4 number of G+2 building into G+4 (All buildings are designed for G+4 structure). This will enable the University to save considerable amount being paid as rent, transportation charges, electricity etc. The

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University now spread out in 4 campuses at Kasaragod can be brought into one campus, which is an administrative necessity also. According to which it is proposed to construct two more additional floors for four Science Department buildings. The F.C examined the estimate cost of the vertical extension which will be Rs.35.35 Crore only as per the estimate submitted by RITES.

The Exe-Engineer also informed that, there would be a savings of Rs.22.17 Crores with reference to the sanctioned amount and the tender value in respect of the 8 academic buildings now under construction. A comparative statement showing estimated cost and savings also produced before the F.C. The F,C has also noted the accrued interest of approximately Rs.7 crore can also be utilized for the purpose of vertical extension and the remaining portions of the fund requirements, if any can be met from the next year's allocation.

The F.C examined the revised estimate and statement of savings along with the communication from M/s RITES Ltd, and deliberated the matter in detail. The F.C noted that construction of two additional floors as proposed above shall obviate the need for undertaking capital works worth Rs.274/- crore earlier planned. Moreover, the University will not be required to undertake any new construction until UGC sanction new academic departments, if the present vertical extension is carried out. The F.C also noted that while undertaking the present construction of academic buildings there will be a saving of Rs.29.17 crore and that not much additional funds are required for the vertical extension now proposed. Therefore the F.C agreed to the proposal of vertical extension of 4 academic buildings now under construction subject to the work being carried out as per the CPWD manual and GFR provisions. Accordingly, F.C recommended the proposal for vertical extension of four academic buildings for Rs.35.35/- crore for administrative approval and expenditure sanction of the E.C.

FC:03:03:07(v)

To consider according Administrative Approval for engaging M/s. RITES Ltd as Engineering Consultant and PMC holder for the construction of Building under the scheme PMMMNMTT.

The University has received the first installment of Rs.2, 70,50000/- for the construction of Building under Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) scheme. The amount has to be utilized by the University within the financial year as per the communication from the PMMMNMTT.

Therefore, the CPWD has been approached for undertaking construction, but as they have wound up their construction activities within the University, they are not ready to take up the work. In this context, quotations were obtained from Govt, of India PSUs including the ongoing PMC holder Ms. RITES Ltd. The PMC charge quoted by the FEDO (FACT Engineering and Design Organization) is 7% whereas the M/s. RITES Ltd expressed willingness to execute the work at 5.40%. According Rule 176 of GFR, a particular consultant can be selected for entrusting work under special direumstances. In view of the provisions in Rule 176, the RITES may be selected as the consultant for executing the civil works of PMMMNMTT Scheme, the justification being RITES is the present PMC holder involved in the major construction activities in the University at a considerably reasonable and lower sate of PMC charges.

The Building Committee vide its resolution BC:20:09 dated 08:09,2016 considered and approved M/s. RITES Ltd as the PMC holder as well as Engineering consultant for the above work based on their lowest quotation as 5.4% (  $3.90 \pm 1.56 = 5.40$ ).

The P.C examined the proposal along with the remarks of the IS & FA of MHRD that award of works should be strictly regulated as per the relevant provisions of GFR and CVC Guidelines. Accordingly, the F.C recommended for following the procedure for selection of PMC holder as per the relevant provisions of GFR and the recent UGC Guidelines and revert to FC.

FC:03:03:07(vi)	To report the purchase of about 25 Cents (Approx.) of land at Munnamkadavi
	for the proposed water supply scheme for the Central University of Kerala utilizing the State Government Funds,

Based on our request, Kerala Water Authority has submitted a detailed project report for the implementation of drinking water supply scheme for the exclusive use of University amounting to Rs10.50 Crores. Now we have received Administrative and Financial sanction for the above work from the Govt. of Kerala vide G O.Rt. 2514/2016/HEDN dated 22.09.2016 and G.O (Rt.) No. 9104/2016/Fin dated 21.11.2016. For the effective implementation of the above project, we have to construct an intake well cum Purop house in Karichery River at Munnamkadavu near the bridge. In addition to which an approach road from the Periya – Munnamkadavu road to the intake well and pump house has also to be constructed. For these purposes, the University has to acquire about 25 cents (approx.) from the private property in R.S. no. 313/2 of Periya Village owned by Smt. Fareeda W/o Ismail Moonnamkadavu. The purchase of the above private land can be done at the prevailing rate fixed by the Revenue Department, Govt. of Kerala, utilizing the State Govt. funds.

The following remarks in this regard has been received from the JS & FA, MHRD:

"As per the existing Government of India Policy on the subject; land for the University has to be made by the State Government free of cost and without any encumbrances. It is not within the competence of any of the statutory body of the University to take any decision to the contrary. Resettlement of settlers is the sole responsibility of the State Government and the question of incurring any expenditure in this regard does not arise. Financial implication on the purchase has also not been clearly indicated.

Since, there is no clarity on the subject; the proposal is not supported for approval. In case any further elarification is needed, the matter may be referred to UGC/MHRD for specific advice."

The F C deliberated the issue and came to the conclusion that the purchase of 25 cent of land at the prevailing rate fixed by the Revenue Department is for the water supply scheme of the University, fully funded by the State Govt, and no cost is involved on the part of the University or UGC. Therefore the F.C considered the proposal and recommended to the E.C for approval.

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The First Executive Council in its Eighth meeting held on 27th March, 2012, has resolved to adopt New Pension Scheme to all the employees of Central University of Kerala in accordance with the orders issued by the Government of India on New Pension Scheme.

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MINUTES OF THE THIRD MEETING OF THE THIRD FIC OF CENTRAL UNIVESITY OF KERALA HELD ON 27.1.2017

As per UGC Letter No.51-1/2009(CU) dated the 13th January, 2012, it is clarified that employees coming from pensionable establishments would be governed by pension scheme of the parent department till such time they retain Lien with the parent post. Hence, Employees of New Organization (established on or after 1.1.2004) will be governed by New Pension Scheme (NPS). There is no provision for carrying the pension scheme of parent organization when the organization itself does not have a pension scheme. According to PPRDA Letter No. PPRDA/2014/3/PDEX/12dated 22nd April, 2014 communicated by UGC vide Letter No.F.1-2/2004 (CU) dated 5th June, 2014, PPRDA has decided to enroll all eligible Government employees (Central & State) who are on the rolls of the government in to NPS, irrespective of the age at the time of entry, subject to the condition that the total period of contribution to NPS account shall not be more than 42 years.

Since the Govt. of Instruction on the subject are clear and self-explanatory, as informed by the JS & FA, MHRD, the agenda item is dropped.

Smt. K. Vibgyor, an Assistant of the Central University of Kerala, after being suffered from Brain Aneurysm was admitted at M/s A J Hospital & Research Centre, Mangalore on 14th October 2016 and had been in a critical care. Based on the request submitted by Shri Akhilesh Gopinath, son of Mrs. Vibjyor, an amount of Rs. 4,00,000/- was sanctioned as medical advance to Mrs. Vibgiyor vide Order No. CUK/EST/MR/NT/PF-08/KV/16 dated 15th October 2016 and released in favour of M/s A J Hospital and Research Centre, Mangalore. The advance was given as per the provisions in the Medical Attendance Rules.

In view of the comments from the JS& FA, MHRD, on this matter should be strictly regulated as per the relevant provisions of Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, the agenda item is dropped.

UGC had earlier communicated the XII Plan allocation under General Development Assistance (GDA) to Central University of Kerala vide letter of even number dated 10th June, 2013 as approved by the Commission in its meeting held on 10th May, 2013 and also conveyed item-wise allocation vide letter of even number dated 27th May, 2014 on the basis priorities decided by the university. Subsequently, UGC conducted a mid-term review of the Central Universities and conveyed the revised XII Plan allocation vide UGC letter of number even dated 21st August, 2015.

- Further, UGC constituted an Expert Committee for conducting a review of the 2. central universities and allocation of GDA to 40 Central Universities and one medical college which are fully funded by UGC.
- The report of the Committee was placed before the Commission at its meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 2016. Based on the recommendations of the Committee and availability of funds from Govt. of India, Commission has approved the revised XII Plan allocation in respect of Central University of Kerala under Plan at Rs.397,25,00,000/- (Rupees Three Hundred Ninety Seven Crore Twenty Five Lakhs Only) which also includes allocation for Non-Net Fellowship for M.Phil./ Ph.D. scholars.
- 4. As the sufficient funds are available under the head of capital assets, the Commission has not approved any enhancement. However, keeping in view of the pace of expenditure under recurring head and salary head, the allocation under recurring head has been enhanced from Rs.35.00 cr. to Rs.40.00 cr. and allocation under salary head has been enhanced from Rs.45.00 cr. to Rs.50.00 cr.

 The following general observations/comments of the Committee have been approved by the Commission for appropriate action on the part of University.

# (i) Prioritisation of needs

New construction is the basic requirement of most of the new CUs. It has been observed that in many cases, the building plans have not been taken up systematically and by setting up of priorities. New buildings have been started without considering the availability of funds at a given point of time for this purpose. It has resulted in many buildings coming up simultaneously resulting in partially built structures which are unsuitable for any use. It is suggested that the universities may prioritise construction activities as per their basic needs including staff quarters, hostels, academic blocks and schools for children to attract good teachers to join the university. Specially, construction of girls' hostel should be assigned high priority in view of the vulnerability of girl students. Other priority areas are purchase of equipments, books and journals, wi-fi connection in the entire camous, boys' hostel, health centre and students' activity centre. Importantly, it is desirable to have a detailed master plan which should be followed up systematically and executing the construction work of new buildings in a phased manner.

## (ii) Creation of Internal Resources

It has been observed that there is general and overwhelming tendency to depend on the government funds for running the affairs of the universities. The Committee observed that no serious efforts are being made by most of the CUs to generate internal resources by utilizing the facilities available with them. It is, therefore, pertinent to impress upon the

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CUs to find out ways and means to enhance internal resources. In this context, the attention of the universities needs to be drawn to the recommendations of the Justice Punayya Committee dealing with generation of internal resources in universities.

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## (iii) Research

Research is an integral part of academics. Besides developing modern and competitive academic programmes, it is of paramount importance to establish state-of-the-art research facilities and carry out quality research by the universities. It is a matter of great concern that, in general, the quality of research in various central universities has remained very modest. It is essential that each university must identify thrust areas and establish suitable facilities for carrying out quality research and also establish internal quality assessment cells. The Committee also recommends that each university should bring out annual research report and develop national and international collaboration with reputed research centres.

#### (iv) Vacancies

(a) The Committee recommends that immediate attention be paid to put in place a mechanism which will ensure that no Vice-Chancellor position remains vacant. (b) Absence of regular Registrar and Finance Officer in certain universities has caused postponement of administrative and financial decisions at the appropriate time. Since these are very crucial positions in the university governance, efforts need to be made to ensure that these positions do not remain vacant. (c) Large scale vacancies of teaching staff in most of the universities is a matter of serious concern. It is an impediment to impart quality education, guiding research as well as to give practical shape to new innovations and effective implementation of schemes. Leadership of the university must ensure to fill-up the positions in time.

The university may keep the above goints in view while utilising the XII Plan allocation under GDA. In addition to above, the following points already communication to you vide DO letter of even number dated 10<sup>th</sup> June, 2013 are again reiterated for information and necessary action:-

1. The XII Plan General Development Assistance to universities is being provided in the form of Plan Block Grant. It includes construction/renovation of buildings (including renovation of heritage buildings), campus development, staff, books & journals, laboratory, equipment and infrastructure, annual maintenance contract, innovative research activities, university-industry linkages, extension activities, cultural activities, development of ICT, health care, student amenities including hostels, Non-NET Fellowships to M.P hil/Ph.D. students, Travel Grant, Conferences/Seminars/Symposia/Workshops, Publication Grant, Appointment of Visiting Professor/Visiting Fellow and Establishment of Career &

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interest

Counselling Cell, Day Care Centre, basic facilities for women and Faculty Development Programme, etc.

- The concept of Merged Schemes introduced during the XI Plan has been done away with and no separate grant under the Merged Schemes is being provided during the XII Plan.
- It is also mentioned here that the following schemes which were earlier part of Merged Schemes are now being implemented as independent scheme by a dedicated cell of UGC and separate grant will be provided by UGC under these schemes.
  - (i) Equal Opportunity Cell-
  - (ii) Remedial Coaching for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority community students
  - (iii) Coaching for NET for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority community students
  - (iv) Coaching Classes for entry into services for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and minority students.
  - (v) Scheme for persons with disabilities
- Two independent scheme namely, Internal Quality Assurance Cell and Construction
  of Women Hostel are also being implemented as independent schemes in all central
  universities during XII Plan.
- 5. The scheme called Enhancing Scholarly/Faculty Resources-ENCORE which was initiated during XI Plan is now a part of XII Plan General Development Assistance. No separate funding will be provided for this scheme.
- 6. No building proposals in case of the universities should be sent to UGC for approval. The building proposals may be approved at the University level itself. However, Building Committee should be constituted as per UGC guidelines. The university may also place the building proposals before the Finance Committee for its approval, after obtaining the approval from the Building Committee. The university may not award the building projects over and above the allocation made by UGC under Capital Assets. The university may sand the completion documents to UGC after completion of building projects.
- 7. University may not initiate the Works / Projects like approach road, water pipe line, electric sub-station etc. which are the responsibility of the State Government. University may take up such matter with State Government or Central Government as the case may be.
- 8. The Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) vide its letter No.011/VGL/014 dated 11th February, 2011 has circulated the instructions on "Transparency in Tendering System" and No.01-11-CTE-SH-100 dated 17.02.2011 (copy anclosed) regarding "Mobilization Advance". Therefore, the construction work should be as per General Financial Rules, 2005 and the instructions issued by CVC from time to time.

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- 9. University may follow the General Financial Rules, 2005 and take urgent necessary action to amend their manuals of financial procedures to bring them in conformity with GFRs 2005 and those universities which do not have their own approved manuals on financial procedure, may adopt the provisions of GFRs 2005 and instructions/guidelines issued theraunder from time to time. University may also follow the instruction of Ministry of Finance O.M. No.F.29/1/2015-PPD dated 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2016 (copy enclosed) regarding Rule 126 of the GFR pertaining to execution of the work by Public Works Organisations (PWOs).
- The University may strictly follow the Government of India/UGC guidelines regarding implementation of the reservation policy (both vertical for SCs, STs & OBCs and horizontal for persons-with-disability etc) in teaching and non-teaching posts.
- 11. In addition to above, the following administrative reforms may also be implemented:-
  - Implementation of Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act,
     2006 and Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Amendment
     Act, 2012
  - All statutory posts should be filled by appointment through Selection Committee as per UGC Regulations.
  - All vacant teaching posts should be filled up expeditiously.
- 12. The release of grant will also be linked to academic and administrative reforms as well as compliance of various policies of the UGC and the Government of India as indicated above.
- 13. As per UGC (Mandatory Assessment and Accreditation of Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2012, it is mandatory for each Higher Educational Institution to get accredited by the Accreditation Agency after passing out of two batches or six years whichever is earlier, in accordance with the norms and methodology prescribed by such agency or the Commission, as the case may be. Therefore, university may go for accreditation if it has not been done so far, failing which UGC will take appropriate action for withholding of all grants.
- 14. University may maintain a separate account under plan schemes for creation of sapital assets (Non-Recurring), Grant-In-Ald General-(recurring) and salary head and furnish the year wise information to UGC for each item of expenditure incurred under Plan Grant indicating General, SC and ST components separately.
- 15. The <u>University may not create any position at its level and may obtain prior</u> administrative approval of UGC for creation of any teaching posts, if it is required essentially.
- 16. For creation of non-teaching positions, the university may follow the teaching to non-teaching ratio at 1:1.1 and send the proposal to UGC for administrative approval for creation of non-teaching positions, keeping the above ration in mind.

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17. It is repeated that the university must have already initiated the Academic Reforms as circulated by the UGC vide D.O.No.F.1-2-2008 (XI Plan) dated 31st January, 2008 and subsequent reminder vide D.O.No.F.1-2/2008 (XI Plan) dated 17th October, 2012 (copy enclosed).

18 It may also be ensured that the university has adopted the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of M.Phil./Ph.D. Degree), Regulations, 2016.

- 19. In the end, I would request you to ensure that the utilization of the grants received by the university is repeated to the UGC in time to enable smooth management of funds and to avoid unnecessary audit objections. The release of grant would depend on the pace of expenditure by the University & timely submission of utilization certificate / statement of expenditure.
- 20. As already decided, all central universities shall implement Choice Based Credit System (CBCs).

To report the EC Resolution No.EC:02:11:04 regarding reduction of rate of University Hostel Rent paid by the Students

The Minutes of the Eleventh Meeting of the Second Finance Committee held on 19th March, 2016 has resolved to reduce the hostel rent from Rs.3000/- to Rs.2500/- per Student per Semester. The Finance Committee also resolved to enhance the hostel rent in every three years @ 10% of the existing amount rounded to nearest multiple of ten rupees.

The Fifteenth meeting of the Second Executive Council held on 20th March, 2016 after detailed discussion resolved to reduce the hostel rent from Rs.3000/- to Rs.2000/- per Student per Semester.

Since there was a difference in the resolutions of the Executive Council and the Finance Committee, the matter was referred to the MHRD twice vide letter No. CUK/VCF-1/2016/1308 dated September 28, 2016 and 23th November, 2016. A copy of the resolution of the Executive Council and the letters addressed to the MHRD.

The Executive Council being the Principal Executive body of the University, the resolution of the Executive Council to reduce the hostel rent from Rs.3000/- to Rs.2000/- has been already implemented.

However, the JS&FA,MHRD communicated that the decision of the E.C is not to be ratified.

While noting the agenda item, the F.C wanted to reiterate the UGC instructions and guidelines issued from time to time with regard to the need for generating additional internal revenue by the University.

## REVISED GUIDELINES FOR POST GRADUATE MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR UNIVERSITY RANK HOLDERS AT UNDER GRADUATE LEVEL APPLICABLE FROM THE YEAR 2008-10

#### INTRODUCTION

Higher Education has had played a very vital role in the history of nation building all over the world. It is amply clear that no rise in general standards of living and culture is possible without strengthening the higher education system in the country. It obviously calls for a multipronged strategy. There is a need to modernize our higher education system, and equally important to continuously attract young and talented students to pursue higher education. It is being increasingly observed that the brighter lot is not pursuing Post-Graduate education in our institutions of higher learning. To emerge as a powerful nation, there is an urgent need to bring in talented boys and girls in the fold of Post-Graduate education by way of providing them good incentives in the form of scholarships. The UGC, therefore, introduced a Post-Graduate Merit Scholarship Scheme for University rank holders both in General and Honours Courses at Undergraduate level.

The scholarship may be tenable for a period of two years to enable the rank holders of each university at undergraduate level to pursue their Master's Degree. All universities/degree awarding institutions would be required to issue rank certificates to the toppers of the university (not at college level) both in General and Honours Courses namely B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. The purpose of this scheme is to attract talent for pursuing post graduate studies besides strengthening the basic subjects — General as well as Honours, at Undergraduate level. The awardees, under this scheme, can pursue their Postgraduate programme in any area of specialization in any institution of higher learning in the country.

#### OBHECTIVES OF THE SCHEME

The objectives of the scheme are:

- a) to promote and nurture talent;
- to reward meritorious students with outstanding performance at the Under graduate level for pursuing postgraduate studies;
- to Promote study in basic subjects both General as well as Honours at undergraduate level. Professional courses are not covered under the scheme;
- to build up academic excellence at postgraduate level across the colleges and universities in the country.

#### **ELIGIBILITY/TARGET GROUP**

- While in General Course the First and Second Rank holders at UG level and admitted in any Postgraduate Course would be awarded the scholarship. In Honours Courses (Main or Major) the scholarship would be awarded only to the First Rank holders. These awardees will have to submit the proof of their merit position at undergraduate level as well as their admission in postgraduate courses.
- The scholarship would, however, be subjected to securing a minimum of sixty per cent marks at undergraduate level.

- The scheme is applicable to such students who have taken admission in regular, fulltime Master's Degree course in any recognized university or a post graduate college.
- The scholarship is available to the student for first PG Degree only. Age limit for the students is 30 years at the time of admission in PG course.
- Distance mode of education is not covered under the scheme.

Following subjects have been identified for the award of scholarships who have passed at Undergraduate level:

Other combinations of subjects are not covered. Before forwarding applications students/Universities may kindly ensure that application satisfy all norms as per guidelines. Applications received for other than the above mentioned subjects will be summarily rejected.

#### NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIP AND TENURE OF SCHOLARSHIP

- The total number of scholarships in the first academic year would be 1800 per year for General Courses and 575 for Honours Courses. The duration of the scholarship will be two years only. The tenure of the scholarship will not be extendable beyond two years, under any circumstances.
- The rank holders would be considered only from those universities (including affiliated colleges) wherein at least 1000 students have appeared in the examination in the General courses and 100 in Honours courses at undergraduate level in the aforesaid programmes.

 Degrees awarded by autonomous college are not covered, but these are to be included in the affiliating university and a common ranking is to be indicated.

## MONITORING / OPERATION OF THE SCHEME

The Scholarship will be awarded by the UGC and will be informed to the concerned Universities and awardees pursuing Master's programmes. The selection will be purely merit based. The scholarship will be disbursed through College/University where the awardees have taken admission in PG Course.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER THE SCHEME

- The financial assistance for the scheme will be provided by the UGC to all the eligible universities/institutions which are under Section 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act. The Universities in turn will be responsible to submit all documents such as Statement of Expenditure and Utilization Certificate etc. to the UGC to settle the accounts.
- Each awardee, under the scheme, will be provided a scholarship of Rs.2,000/- p.m.
  for a period of two years (i.e. 10 months in a year). The second year grant will be
  released after receiving Utilization Certificate and statement of expenditure along
  with the progress report of the first year.
- No other additional grants will be payable in lieu of hostel charges and medical charges etc.

#### OTHER CONDITIONS

- The student who is awarded Post-graduate Scholarship will not be debarred from accepting any other scholarship.
- Students desirous of leaving the studies mid-way without completing the PG degree will have to take prior approval from the UGC by submitting an application along with justification through the concerned university.
- Any student who discontinues studies without prior approval of the UGC will have to refund the whole amount and the concerned institution will be responsible for this.
- The university/college/institution has to submit a certificate of completion of the PG course in respect of each student availing this scholarship.
- No extension is permissible beyond two years.

### CANCELLATION OF SCHOLARSHIP

The UGC may terminate the scholarship of any student in case of:

- a) Misconduct of the awardee, if any, reported by the University/Institution.
- Unsatisfactory progress report (i.e. if the candidate scores less than 60% marks in the first year of Master's programme)
- Candidates being found ineligible at a later date shall face the penal action and will also be liable to refund the entire Scholarship amount paid.

#### DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED

- The candidate is required to submit an application in the prescribed format
- Attested copy of university undergraduate-degree.
- Matriculation certificate.
- A verification certificate by the institute where, students has taken admission to 1st Year P.G. Course.
- Prescribed format of provisional certificate from the university (not for autonomous college).

# CERTIFICATE TO BE SUBMITTED BY THE CONCERNED UNIVERSITY/ INSTITUTION TO THE UGC

Every year University/Institution will submit a compiled statement for the following:

- Statement giving the names of the students selected for the scholarship along with their receipt of scholarship amount.
- Progress Report to be submitted after the first year of the award giving percentage of marks obtained by the candidates.
- c) Utilization certificate.
